The government shouldn't be doing this. 85% of the public tenants here do not want to leave here. All elderly residents are deeply upset, suffering from anxiety and stress. Four people who we are especially worried about are all women in their 80s or close to it. They are frightened to open their doors. They refuse to open their doors because bottom line, they don't want to leave here. Things aren't going well for us. I don't want to leave and if It does happen it will ruin my whole life. It would tear me apart. I wouldn't last a week if I had to go somewhere else. Here I look after my neighbours and they all trust me and come to me with their problems. We've had no contact with the govt whatsoever. Only office of Housing workers. I've tried to get help from Derryn Hinch and Neil Mitchell. But no response. Only that they'll get back to us. I reckon they've got better fish to fry. They don't worry about us. If I leave here I'm afraid my son will be forced back to jail. We don't answer our doors because we know our rights. Anyone who comes knocking in a suit has 2 hopes. Bob Hope and No Hope. They've been told to stay away and that's all there is to it.
