Elderly driver's rib broken in brutal road rage attack

A CYCLIST dragged an elderly driver from his car before punching and kicking him in a vicious road rage attack at Carrum.

The 72-year-old driver, from Carrum Downs, was taken to Frankston Hospital having sustained a broken rib during the April 16 attack.

Sen-Sgt Chris James, of Chelsea police, said the

man was driving in Canberra St about 12.30pm when the cyclist hurled abuse and punched him through a window.

"The offender has then dragged him out of the car and kicked him in the groin, pushed him to the ground and punched him multiple times," Sen-Sgt James said. "It would appear unprovoked."

The offender is described as middle-aged, of thin build and about 1.5m.

He wore blue lycra clothing and a blue and white striped helmet.

The victim remained in hospital late last week.
