Hi Kylie,

Thank you for the opportunity for the Australian Drug Foundation (ADF) to comment on the terms of Reference – Inquiry into Motorcycle Safety.

Through the ADF's *Good Sports* program safe transport strategies, as well as appropriate bar management strategies are included within the program. According to research for every level clubs' achieve, there's a:

- 15% drop in short-term risky drinking;
- 14% drop in long-term risky drinking;
- 20% drop in risky drinking on match days.

As a result –

- There's an 8% drop in drink driving risk for every season a club is involved with the *Good Sports* program; and
- The number of estimated drink drivers goes down for every level of *Good Sports* accreditation.

Should you deem it relevant, the ADF is happy to brief you further on the range of Road Safety activities – both within Victoria as well as other States and Territories.
