**Subject:** Submission on No Jab No Play Bill

Dear Member of Parliament,

I am writing in relation to the proposed “Public Health and Wellbeing Amendment (No Jab, No Play) Bill 2015, which, in my view, is highly discriminatory to children whose parents have responsibly exercised their right not to vaccinate them for any reason. It is my understanding that this Bill will cancel the conscientious objection exemption, leaving only medical contraindication.

It must be noted, however, that family adverse effects are no longer a medical contraindication. In our family we had at least three known to us adverse effects of vaccines, including:

- i) Death of a grown-up person within 1 hour after diphtheria vaccine. His wife grieved so much after her husband’s death that died within a year. The nurse who administered the vaccine was blamed and was fired from her medical establishment.
- ii) Temporary paralysis (which lasted for about 6 months) and permanent blindness of a [REDACTED] r [REDACTED], after she was vaccinated with HPV or DPT+Hepatitis B vaccines.
- iii) [REDACTED] suffering from psoriasis after he was vaccinated with a tuberculosis vaccine at the age of 6.

Our best friends’ son started having seizures after his second DPT vaccine. He is being treated for epilepsy now.

All these cases happened in Russia, where doctors, same as here, claim that vaccines are safe and there are no complications or adverse affects whatsoever. This is not true. Note that most of the vaccines administered to children in Russia are produced by the same pharmaceutical giants that supply vaccines to Australia – Sanofi Avenensis, GlaxoSmithKline, Merc, etc.

Your bill will not move me to vaccinate my 2 children, whatever the cost, as I know vaccines can be deadly to them. But your bill will discriminate my children and my family for our Constitutional right to opt out of a medical procedure we, with a good reason, consider dangerous. We do not reside in Victoria, but we are a highly skilled family who might consider moving to Victoria one day. This will certainly not happen should the Bill be passed.

Passing this Bill will be the first step down a very slippery road. Today you proclaim healthy unvaccinated children not good enough to be part of Australian society. Whom are you going to find ‘not good enough for the society’ next time – handicapped, Jews, blacks?
