ANSWER:

Roads and road safety

8519. MS WOOLDRIDGE — To ask the Minister for Agriculture (for the Minister for Roads and Road Safety): Has VicRoads undertaken any investigations into providing additional safety measures, such as traffic lights or pedestrian crossings along Sherbourne Road, Eltham.

ANSWER:

The section of Sherbourne Road between Karingal Drive and Para Road is a local road managed by Banyule City Council, which works closely with VicRoads.

VicRoads advises me that the declared section of Sherbourne Road, between Karingal Drive and Bolton Street (excluding end points), indicates one reported casualty crash in the five year period to 30 June 2016. This incident involved a vehicle failing to give way while exiting a property on Sherbourne Road.

VicRoads has not received community feedback with regards to road safety and traffic operation at this location. VicRoads would be pleased to investigate any concerns that the community may have with regards to road safety and operation of Sherbourne Road.

The 2016 state budget included a commitment of \$10.2 million to undertake the upgrade of Bolton Street. In November 2015, during the project development stage of Bolton Street, VicRoads held two community consultation sessions to gain a better understanding of how people use Bolton Street and the current challenges on both Bolton Street and the surrounding road network. Approximately 150 people attended these community consultation sessions. The community has played a major role in helping to shape this important project, which will make Bolton street safer, more connected and accessible.

Roads and road safety

8520. MS WOOLDRIDGE — To ask the Minister for Agriculture (for the Minister for Roads and Road Safety): Has VicRoads undertaken any investigations, such as the result of the Black Saturday fire in 2011, into an additional road crossing over the Yarra River to ease traffic congestion in the Nillumbik Shire, if not, why not.

ANSWER:

The Andrews Labor Government recognises that Warrandyte residents encounter traffic congestion on the road network and has worked closely with key stakeholders such as the Warrandyte Community Association, Manningham and Nillumbik councils and Emergency Management Victoria to address this matter.

On 1 March 2016, I announced funding of \$5.1 million to upgrade the Warrandyte Bridge and surrounding intersections. These works will significantly reduce evacuation times for people travelling south over the bridge in the event of an emergency. In addition, this upgrade will reduce daily traffic congestion during morning peak periods and improve safety at the Warrandyte Bridge. This funding will allow widening of the bridge to provide three traffic lanes (one northbound and two southbound lanes) and construction of a new pedestrian path across the Yarra River. Traffic lights will also be installed at a wider Kangaroo Ground-Warrandyte Road and Research-Warrandyte Road intersection. VicRoads indicates that the works will be completed by the end of 2017, prior to the fire danger season.

VicRoads examined additional bridge locations in the Warrandyte area as part of the investigation and determined that the best outcome for this project would be to widen the existing bridge. A second bridge option was considered in the initial investigation. However, a second bridge would have major environmental impacts. Investigations have indicated that the upgrade to the existing bridge will deliver the objectives of the project to improve traffic flow in the event of an emergency and during daily congestion.

VicRoads has worked closely with the local community and local stakeholders to ensure community feedback was considered as part of the design.

Building a second track will allow trains to run in both directions at the same time, enabling more frequent and reliable services for thousands of passengers in Melbourne's growing north-east.

Community consultation for the Hurstbridge track duplication between Heidelberg and Rosanna, and the Lower Plenty Road level crossing removal, commenced in June 2016 with design options presented to the community in September 2016. The announcement of the final design solution for these works is expected in the coming weeks.

The Victorian Government is also investigating further public transport improvements for north-east Melbourne. This includes planning for future track duplication in the area between Greensborough to Eltham, and consultation with key transport and planning stakeholders. Further consultation will be undertaken once options for the extent and location of trackwork are identified.
