**Education: ministerial expenses**

30. **THE HON. M. M. **Housing: capital works budget**

**1276. THE HON. M. M. GOULD** — To ask the Honourable the Minister for Health (for the Honourable the Minister for Housing): What are the details of the capital works budget for the Office of Housing for the 1998–99 financial year.

**ANSWER:**

Housing capital works budget for 1998/99, as summarised in the Victorian 1998/99 budget papers and detailed below, comprises:

- \$53 million for acquisition of transitional housing, to be managed by the community;
- \$34 million for acquisition of Supported Housing to provide accommodation for people with disabilities or the frail aged, who are also clients of other Departmental programs. This stock will include community managed stock and public rental stock;
- \$77.5 million for acquisition of general public rental stock, including reprofiling of the stock to better match the requirements of people who are most in need of housing;
- \$8 million to commence the redevelopment of the Kensington high rise estate.
- \$24.5 million for acquisition of long term community managed housing particularly for groups such as disadvantaged singles, youth, families, people with disabilities, and frail older persons;
- \$8 million for acquisition of Aboriginal Housing administered by the Aboriginal Housing Board Victoria (AHBV);
- \$99.8 million for physical improvement of public rental and community managed stock, including AHBV stock. This includes upgrades, disability modifications, fire safety works, and conversions, where appropriate, of bedsitters to one bedroom units;

Additional capital items for 1998/99:

- \$6.8 million for program assets such as information technology equipment;
- \$1 million for home finance conversions.

The above projects represent direct costs and exclude associated administrative overheads.

**Housing: HEF bond scheme moneys**

**1277. THE HON. M. M. GOULD** — To ask the Honourable the Minister for Health (for the Honourable the Minister for Housing): What amount of HEF and bond scheme monies was expended by region for the 1997 calendar year.

**ANSWER:**

**Housing Establishment Fund (HEF) Expenditure - 1997 Calendar Year**

The Housing Establishment Fund (HEF) is a financial assistance program administered by the Community Housing Group of the Office of Housing. The aim of the program is to establish or maintain secure private rental housing for people at risk of homeless and to provide emergency assistance to avoid homelessness.

HEF specifically provides immediate financial assistance to people in housing crisis and seeks to respond to a range of emergency situations and diverse housing circumstances.

In the 1997 calendar year HEF monies expended by regions were as follows:

HEF budgets are set on a financial year basis. In 1996/97 approximately \$1.7M was distributed, a slight increase on previous years. The budget was markedly increased in 1997/98 to approximately \$4M as part of the implementation of the Transitional Housing Management Program. Therefore, the above figures reflect approximately 50% of each of the two financial year budgets.

**Bond Scheme Expenditure 1997 Calendar Year**

Under the Bond Scheme the Office of Housing makes loans available to low income earners for assistance with private rental bond expenses.

- Transitional Housing Management Program which provides short term accommodation, housing information, referral, and financial assistance to people who are homeless or at risk of homelessness;
- Crisis supported accommodation including refuges for women and children escaping domestic violence, aboriginal people and young people with support needs;
- Group Housing Program which provides long term accommodation for low income people with disabilities;
- Rooming House Program which provides long term accommodation for low income single people; and
- Rental Housing Co-operative Program which provides long term accommodation for low income people who are members of rental housing co-operatives and who participate in the running of the co-operatives and management of their housing.
- Aboriginal Housing Board of Victoria managed properties.

The Community Housing Joint Venture and Common Equity Rental Co-operative (CERC) Programs have not been included in the above data. The CERC Program includes approximately 1500 properties which are owned by the Common Equity Housing Ltd, the property owner and manager of the CERC program. The Joint Venture Program includes in excess of 2100 properties which are owned by various community organisations.
