SUMMARY OF PROCEEDINGS ON BILLS.

Aborigines (Amendment) Bill-(from Assembly-Hon. L. H. S. Thompson)-

Read a first time, 5 May, 1965, p. 112; motion—That this Bill be now read a second time, debate adjourned, 6 May, p. 114; debate resumed; Bill read a second time and passed remaining stages without amendment, 12 May, p. 118. Assented to 18 May. Act No. 7267.

Acquisition of Materials Bill-(from Assembly-Hon. R. J. Hamer)-
