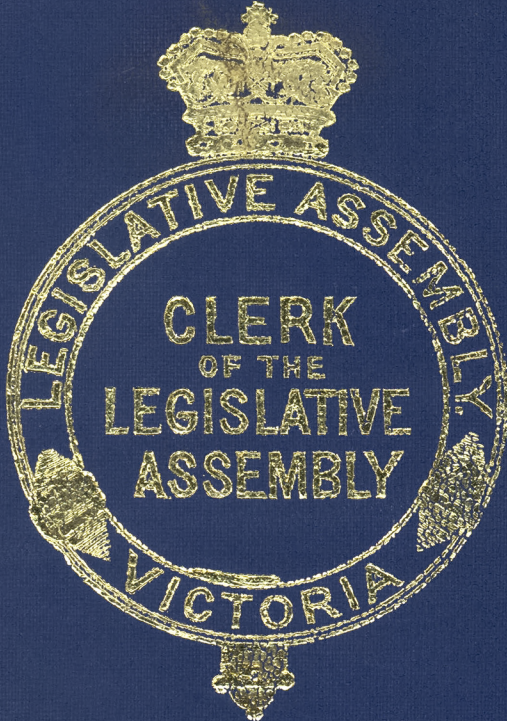

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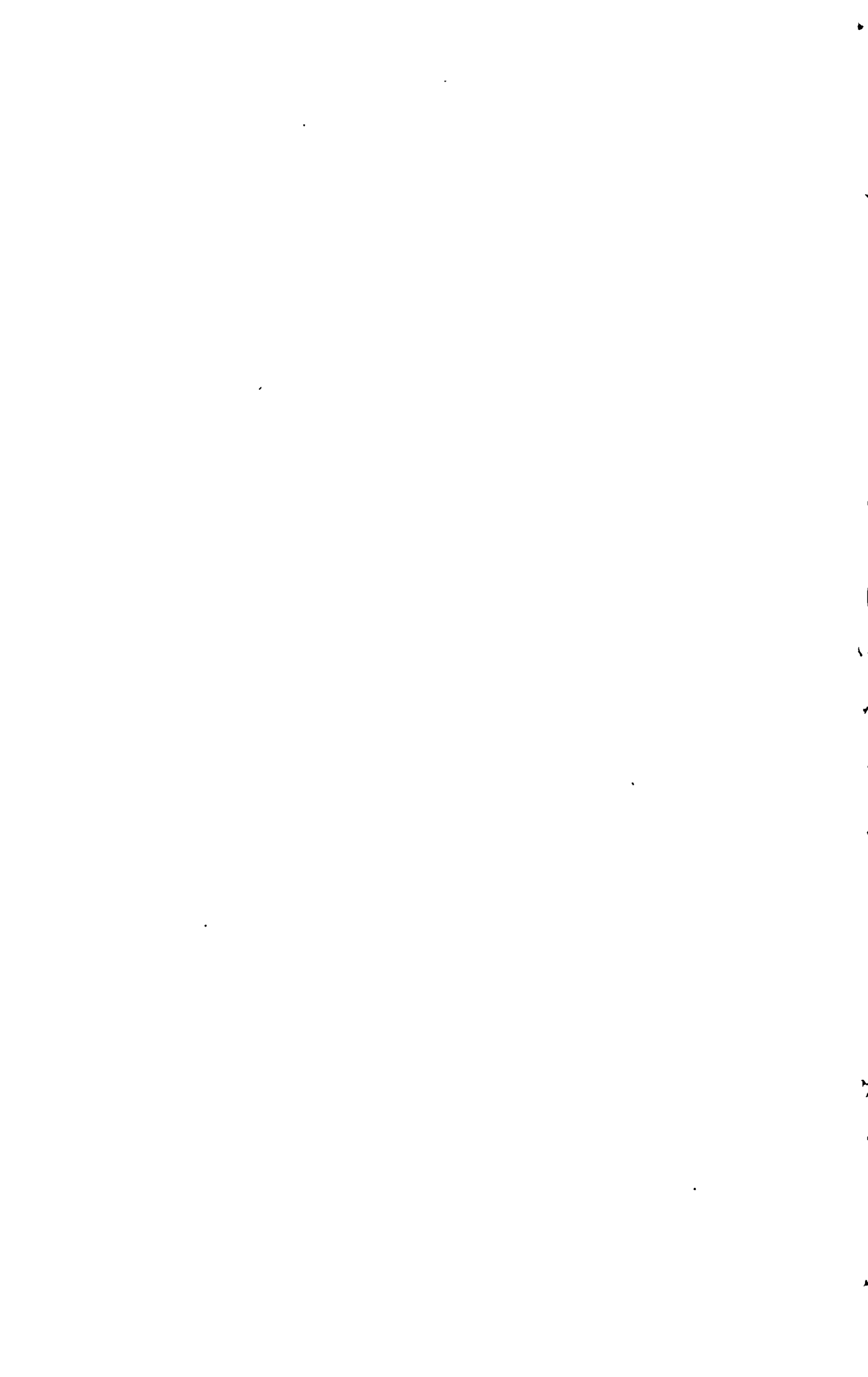

1. INTRODUCTION
The polymerization of vinyl monomers by a cationic mechanism has been studied extensively in the past. The reaction is initiated by a strong acid or a Lewis acid complexed with a suitable co-initiator. The mechanism involves the formation of a carbocationic species which then propagates by adding monomer units to the growing chain end. The rate of polymerization is generally first order in monomer and first order in initiator. The molecular weight of the polymer is dependent on the concentration of the initiator and the nature of the monomer.

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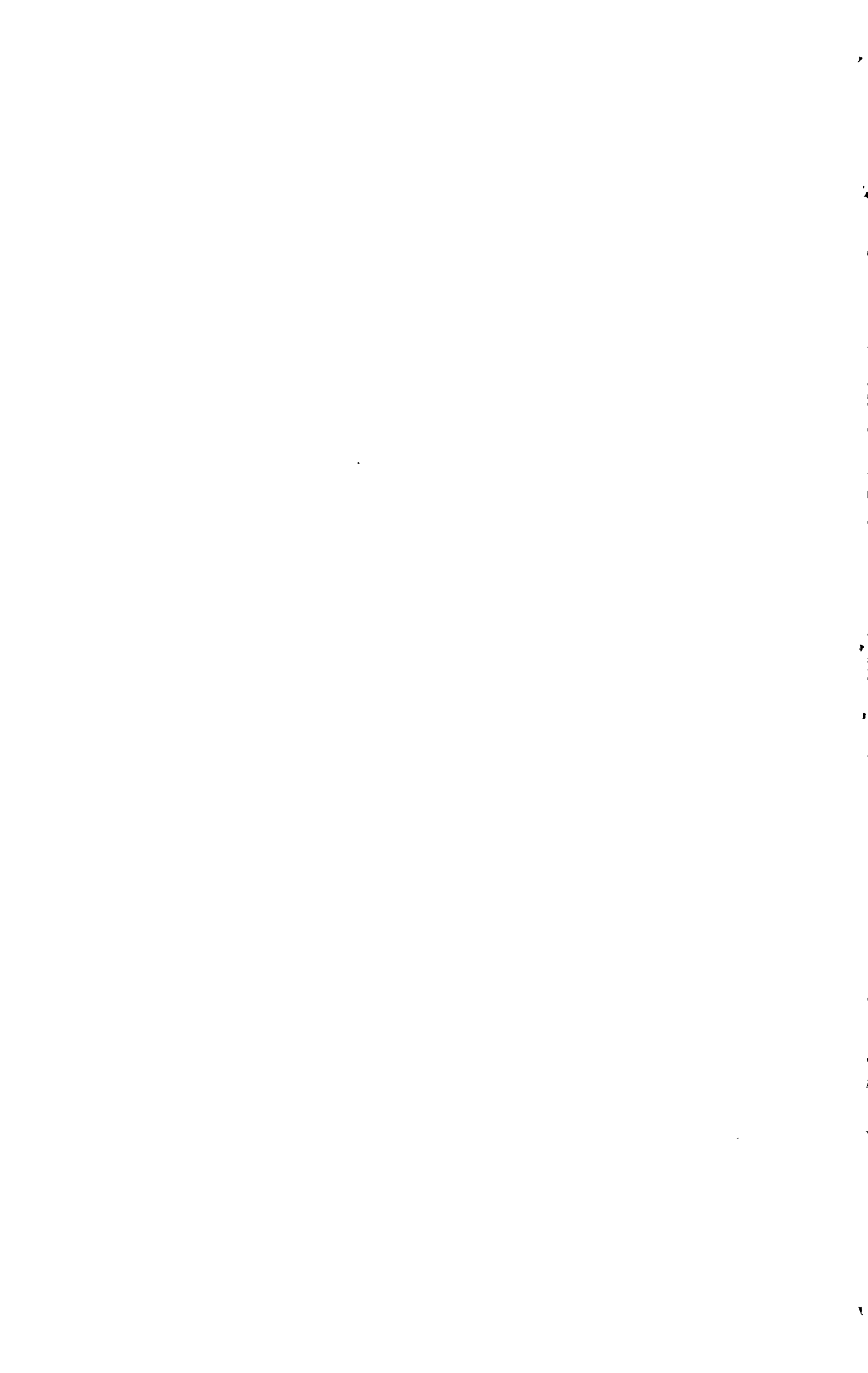

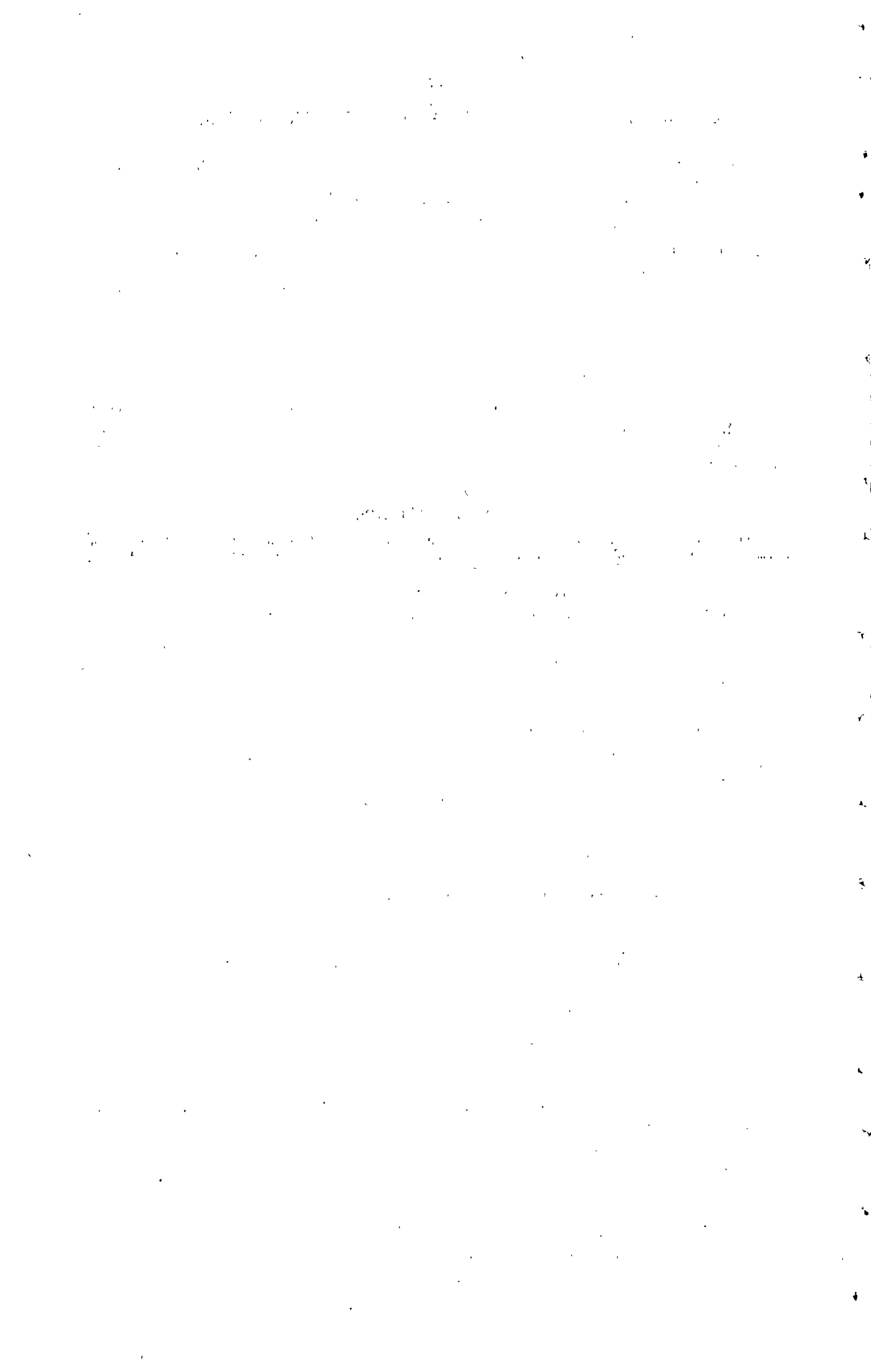
