The Parliament of Victoria is adjourned until the day and hour fixed by the President of the Legislative Council and the Speaker of the Legislative Assembly respectively, I, James Gobbo, Governor of the State of Victoria, acting under section 8 of the Constitution Act 1975 and all other powers vested in me, PROROGUE the Parliament until Tuesday, 17 February 1998, and FIX Tuesday, 17 February 1998 at 2.30 pm as the time for the commencement and holding of the next session of Parliament, for the despatch of business, in the Parliament Houses, situated in Spring Street, Melbourne.

The Honourable the Members of the Legislative Council and the Members of the Legislative Assembly are required to give their attendance at that time and place.

2 MESSAGE FROM HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR - The following message was delivered by the Usher of the Black Rod -

Mr Speaker:

His Excellency the Governor desires the immediate attendance of the Legislative Assembly in the Legislative Council Chamber.

Accordingly, Mr Speaker with the House went to attend His Excellency - And having returned -

[Mr Speaker resumed the Chair at seven minutes past Five o'clock]

- 3 ISSUE OF AND RETURN TO WRIT Mr Speaker announced that, on 17 November 1997, he had issued a Writ for the election of a Member to serve for the Electoral District of Mitcham in the place of the Honourable Roger Pescott, resigned; and that he had received a return to the said Writ by which it stated that Tony Robinson, Esquire, had been duly elected for the Electoral District of Mitcham, in pursuance of the said Writ.
- 4 MEMBER SWORN Tony Robinson, Esquire, was then introduced and took and subscribed the Oath required by law.
- 5 TELEVISING AND BROADCASTING OF QUESTION TIME Motion made, by leave, and question That this House authorises sound and/or visual transmissions and broadcasts from the Legislative Assembly chamber and sound and/or visual broadcasts and rebroadcasts of recordings of proceedings of the Legislative Assembly during question time today (Mr Gude) put and agreed to.
- 6 QUESTIONS (Pursuant to Standing Order No. 124).
- 7 PETITIONS The Clerk announced that the following petitions had been lodged for presentation:
 - **Dental Surgery/Medicine** Seeking that (a) dental surgery or medicine be regulated to ensure that only qualified and registered dental operatives be allowed to practice; and (b) restrictions on who may own dental practices be maintained, bearing 26 signatures (by Mr Ashley)
 - Walkerville Boat Safety Facility Seeking that the proposal put forward to build The Walkerville Boat Safety Facility not be allowed to proceed at Walkerville, now or in the future, bearing 117 signatures (by Ms Davies)
 - Wheelers Hill Boundary Seeking that the boundary of Wheelers Hill be extended to take in the area bounded by Lum Road, Wellington Road, South Eastern Freeway, Springvale Road and Ferntree Gully Road, bearing 2007 signatures (by Mr Smith, Glen Waverley)

- HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR'S SPEECH Mr Speaker reported that the House had, that day, attended His Excellency the Governor in the Legislative Council Chamber, when His Excellency was pleased to make a speech to both houses of Parliament, which speech was as follows:

Mr President and Honourable Members of the Legislative Council:

Mr Speaker and Members of the Legislative Assembly:

- I have called you together today as we reach the midpoint of this term of Parliament in order to focus our attention and that of all Victorians on our objectives over the short time remaining of the 20th century. The separation of the 53rd Parliament into two sessions presents us now with the opportunity to review our progress and achievements since the initial election of my Government in 1992. This is also a fitting time to take a fresh look at our direction ahead.
- The Government's priority will be to ensure the goals of its first phase of development are met by 2001. It will design a blueprint for Victoria's advance into the 21st century for presentation in the year 2000.
- My Government has rebuilt Victoria's inheritance in the past five and a half years. Given the State's dramatically improved performance today, the agenda for this Session of the Parliament will see a marked change in emphasis.
- I am pleased to inform all Victorians my Government will apply expanded criteria to the budget process, legislation brought before the Parliament and initiatives of the Government. Each new measure and each expenditure proposal will be required to undergo the test of social advantage. This signals the next important step forward for Victoria. Budget programs, legislation and initiatives will be tested against four measures in what way they might improve outcomes in education, increase job opportunities, encourage safe, healthy lifestyles and build confident and cohesive communities.
- All my Government's endeavours have been building up to this point. The social advance of Victorians will be the central criterion in determining our State's future direction. The Government will focus on consolidating Victoria as the kind of place that we are able to look on with pride as providing the ideal home, lifestyle and workplace of the 21st century.

- The Government's approach will lead Victorians as they strive in their own lives and local communities, admittedly at times with great difficulty, to improve their position and the general environs of their lifestyle, and so to balance their own interests with those of an increasingly demanding world. We need therefore to examine what we need to do as a partnership of Victorians to strengthen the freedom and independence we enjoy, create a more vibrant sense of community, and mould a cohesive, caring society. We need to work at ways to ameliorate the uncertainty that some feel in an era of such runaway change. These will be the essential factors that determine the nature and strength of modern Victoria, and make a defining difference in the day to day lives of Victorians.
- This next step will position Victoria for the lifestyle and opportunities of the 21st century. It is a task made easier and for which we are much better prepared as a result of the changes that have been implemented and achievements that have been made since 1992. My Government will not waver from the fundamental principles that have brought us to this point to provide strong, but fair, leadership, to plan for the long term, to maintain a consistent policy approach, to work as a partnership with Victorians, and to open Victoria to a global environment.
- The Government believes it has a duty to pursue low risk policies with taxpayers' money, and will accordingly continue applying sound economic and financial management. The resultant strong Budget facilitates quality services, a reducing tax burden, growing investment in infrastructure, and low and reducing debt and liabilities. Victoria is leading Australia and, in some cases, the world in economic reforms, and is pursuing a highly successful, proactive industry policy. The Government will continue this policy mix, which has been the source of much progress since 1992.
- The State is in a healthy trading position. Debt has been reduced from \$30.6 billion, or around 30% of Gross State Product, in 1992 to \$11.3 billion today, down to 8.6% of Gross State Product. Annual budgets are now run at a surplus as a matter of practice. No longer do we borrow from our children to pay our way today.
- Victoria's international credit rating, downgraded four notches between 1990 and 1992 under the previous Government, has been clawed back to just one step from triple-A.
- The reform of the major services education, health, social care and public transport has been given equal attention to ensure services are high quality, readily accessible, meet the needs of Victorians and perform efficiently. Victoria is leading Australia in service levels in each of these fields, as well as in structuring the key services in such a way that they will be able to evolve and adapt in pace with our changing needs. Despite the improvement, my Government acknowledges still more needs to be done in the years ahead.
- Extensive reform of justice and the safety of Victorians in their homes and communities have been two important priorities. Tougher sentences have been introduced to ensure those convicted of crimes incur penalties in line with community expectations. Changes in the prison system also give prisoners a better chance at life. The State's old jails have all been closed and replaced in the main by private prisons which are more humane, more secure and committed to the rehabilitation of prisoners. At the same time the access of Victorians to the law has been improved significantly through a major upgrading of facilities and the use of new technology.
- A recent Crime Victimisation Survey has confirmed the picture emerging from the Australian Bureau of Statistics over this decade that Victoria is the safest state in Australia. A co-operative effort by the Victoria Police, Transport Accident

Commission and the community generally has seen the number of Victorians killed on the roads reduced to a record low of 377 last year. The Government, however, regards that as an unacceptable waste of lives, and has intensified its ongoing Safety First strategy with the objective of progressively lowering the number of road deaths in coming years.

Under this administration unprecedented numbers of women have been appointed to senior positions in the public sector, public advisory bodies and the judiciary. The appointments are part of a policy which encourages the recognition of women for their endeavours, promotes career development for women, and assists them in combining their roles in their families and the workplace. As a landmark project, it has converted the former Queen Victoria Hospital to become a home for the women of Victoria.

During the past Session, the Parliament has provided bipartisan support for a series of motions which underline the importance of Victoria's diverse international society and commit Victorians to reconciliation with our indigenous people. It has reaffirmed Victorians as a free, independent people who are able to live together with great understanding and dignity. We are fortunate in Victoria to be a community which rejects intolerance and racism.

The changes which have been put in place and the renewed emphasis on social advantage over the rest of this term illustrates that the Government sees its role as a dynamic process. The objectives that have been met as a result of reforms since 1992 form part of a broader context. They have been driven by a concern to make the most of living in Victoria for all Victorians. My Government will continue providing leadership on decisions to shape the future social, economic and cultural dimensions of the State. It is this which has distinguished it from other governments in Australia.

The Government has been initiating a stream of efficiency improvements, providing new cuts in taxes and charges which come into effect from this year, to lift Victoria's standard of living. The biggest single reduction involves a \$1.3 billion dividend on water costs, which will yield an average 18% cut in household water bills across the State from this year. This incorporates \$450 million in capital works and 500 new jobs in the water industry in country Victoria. Again this year, the Government has frozen public transport fares.

The development of the competitive Victorian electricity market has produced substantial gains in industry efficiency and benefits to customers. Customers who have the ability to choose their supplier are already gaining substantial price reductions, and these benefits are expected to flow to customers generally including households - when all customers have the right to choose their supplier from December, 2000.

With greater improvements in efficiency, the Government is introducing a new measure to enable franchise customers to share these benefits ahead of the time at which they are able to join the competitive market.

For the next three years, therefore, winter power bills will be reduced by \$60 for each Victorian household and small business, in addition to the winter concession received by concession card holders. This reduction in the cost of electricity for franchised customers has been made possible by the Government's decision to return to consumers revenue from electricity franchise fees paid by the privatised industry and is expected to amount to a cut of more than \$120 million in power costs each year for households and small businesses.

- These measures build on the substantial cost reductions delivered through the pegging of electricity, gas and water charges below the inflation rate for the past three years, lower council rates, a \$106 million a year cut in tax on petrol and diesel from last June, and cuts for businesses in payroll taxes and workers' compensation premiums.
- The Government will complete further groundbreaking reforms with the privatisation of all public transport services in the next 12 months. This program will coincide with the full implementation of automated ticketing across all modes of public transport, and is expected to bring additional improvements in services as well as cost savings.
- The main, broad objectives for these next two years match the aspirations of Victorians for prosperity, safety, security, good health, and to live in pleasant surroundings and within a tolerant, cohesive society.
- The priority is for Victoria to build a dynamic future for its coming generations with education as the basis of a vital economic and social strategy. The State has made enormous advances in education using online technology, providing greater autonomy for school communities, greater emphasis on curriculum and through reforms being implemented this year to the Victorian Certificate of Education. We are leading Australia in providing options for students to undertake vocational education and training.
- In order to give young Victorians maximum access to the opportunities of the age of information and knowledge, the Government is taking the necessary steps now to bring about further improvement in classroom standards. Specifically, targets have been established for Victorian students to attain 100% proficiency in literacy by 2005 and to be among the top five in the world in mathematics and science by 2010.
- The Government will work with its newly formed Science, Engineering and Technology Task Force to find solutions to two major obstacles the substantial drop off in the number of secondary students choosing physical and chemical sciences, and the extremely low proportion of primary school teachers who specialise in teaching science.
- The second major focus is to generate new jobs. Obviously, as the Government fully recognises, having a job is the crucial determinant in people's standard of living, and it is equally necessary for us to have a strong, growing and resilient economy to maintain growth in jobs. The number of Victorians in employment has recently reached record levels, with Victoria recording the largest fall in unemployment of any State in 1997. This area continues, however, to remain a high priority for the Government. Specific industry and employment policies will be directed towards maintaining high investment and export growth, reducing our taxation levels and generating the highest level of economic growth per head of population in Australia.
- The Government will work to ensure all Victorians have the opportunity to share in the prosperity derived from a nationally and internationally competitive economy. Its business development targets will include special focus on natural resources and regional and rural businesses to ensure equitable job growth in country Victoria.
- Thirdly, the Government will step up its already successful efforts to provide a safe and healthy lifestyle for Victorians. It will endeavour to reduce even further our comparatively low rate of crime and ensure people are able to live with a greater sense of personal security.
- The Government is committed to the ongoing expansion and reform of health services which has seen dramatic improvement in access and more appropriate care for Victorians in the areas of acute, mental health and aged care services.

The distribution of health care facilities is being re-mapped and the application of telemedicine services is being extended in line with marked demographic shifts in Victoria so that facilities and services are closer to where people live. The recent opening of the \$70 million Epping Hospital provides firm evidence of this policy at work. Among other projects, a \$36 million health facility is being built at Broadmeadows, and the Latrobe Hospital will provide state of the art health care and a far wider range of community care services for the people of the Latrobe Valley when it opens later in the year. Even though it is to be a privately developed and owned hospital, it will provide access to public patients on exactly the same basis as any other public hospital in the State.

The Government's concern for the natural and urban environments as an important factor underpinning our quality of life has been highlighted with substantial improvements to existing parks and the creation of new parks and reserves, the development of Victoria's first comprehensive coastal strategy, and major environmental projects in Melbourne. The need to maintain the already high quality of our air, water and land as the population grows and economic activity increases is a fundamental challenge the Government will meet as it moves forward with strategies to improve the State's attractiveness.

As a fourth major objective, the Government will work with the broader Victorian community on a range of fronts to create a more confident and cohesive society. Specific programs range from ensuring we tackle complex problems such as drug and alcohol abuse, homelessness and youth suicide, to issues as basic as fostering consideration for others. Support will be provided to volunteers in whatever field they work, and awareness programs will be run to promote increased courtesy and consideration in the areas that have most impact on people's lives.

The \$100 million *Turning the Tide* on drugs program is being extended and resources are being committed to implement recommendations of the Suicide Prevention Task Force. These programs have been developed as part of a community wide endeavour to tackle two of the major social pitfalls of our age, and provide lifeguards to help young Victorians gain confidence and greater access to opportunities under the banner of the Government's Youth Life Force initiatives. Over four years, the Government is also providing \$100 million to support the legion of people who provide unpaid, round the clock care for people with disabilities, chronic and mental illness, and the elderly.

Key elements of the Victorian communications and multimedia strategy are coming into service, and by the end of this year the Government will be well advanced towards its objective to put all Government services and information online by 2001. The *maxi* electronic service delivery network is operating and its hallmark, touchscreen kiosks are currently being installed around the State. By midyear the VicOne network will be rolled out, providing a broadband link to all Government offices and facilities, including schools, hospitals and police stations.

Universal access to online technology - and access to training in the use of the technology - are the keys to our success. To this end, funding is progressively being approved for more than 100 *Skills.net* centres, which will give more than 40,000 Victorians the opportunity to gain a working knowledge of the Internet. The Government has also funded the recent establishment of Viclink, which has trebled the number of public Internet computers available at Victorian libraries and thus builds significantly on the community network already established by Vicnet.

Community service and access are two elements of a broader strategy to establish Victoria as a major high technology centre within Asia Pacific. The drive for new business in this sector has brought \$1.2 billion in new investment and thousands of

- new jobs to Victoria and strengthened the State's position as Australia's main research and development centre.
- The State's research and development effort will gain additional impetus from the work of the Science, Engineering and Technology Task Force, which has already proved its worth in its first six months and will have the role over the next couple of years of setting the agenda to enhance Victoria's knowledge base. The Government recognises medical research as a strategic advantage to Victoria and it will accordingly have special focus in new policy on research and development.
- New technology has special importance in providing information and services, as well as business links and a promotional outlet, for country Victorians. In the space of just a few years it will have removed the barrier of distance for people in the country.
- On a major wave of investment in food production and value adding in country centres, the Government has stepped up activity under its Food Victoria initiative, and the State is expected to exceed its objective to treble food exports to \$6 billion a year by 2001. The Partnerships for Growth program, designed to promote rural development and fund new facilities in country areas, has proved an outstanding success in its first year with one new project being approved every second day.
- In order to build on the work of these programs and redefine its longer term vision for country Victoria, the Government will develop a new rural policy in consultation with country communities over the course of this year. The policy will be designed to strengthen the economies and social fabric of country communities, and will be supplemented by five specific regional development strategies.
- Victoria is undergoing an era of investment at record levels in civic and economic infrastructure. The strength of the State's financial position is reflected in the fact that this rebuilding is being accomplished with no new debt. The Budget works program, together with projects financed by dedicated funds such as Agenda 21, the Community Support Fund and Better Roads Victoria, are adding to confidence, improving the lifestyle of Victorians and creating thousands of new jobs.
- Between now and the turn of the century, Victorians can look forward to the completion of the major City Link infrastructure project, a number of additional key civic projects as part of the Agenda 21 program and extensive development of community facilities with money from the Community Support Fund. These projects, including the Museum, Federation Square, Old Customs House and the first stages of Docklands, will help to present a new face for Victoria and equip us with the civic infrastructure to serve the State through the 21st century.
- The end of the Government's first planning timeframe will also be marked by a sequence of celebrations the like of which our present generations have never seen. Work is under way on celebrations for the arrival of the Olympics in Australia and the end of the millennium in 2000, and in 2001 the commemoration of Victoria's predominant role in Australia's Federation a century earlier.
- These landmarks in history are part of the excitement that's yet to come as our State moves into a new era one that we trust will bring continuing growth in prosperity and security for Victorians. They are occasions and images which the children of the times will carry with them forever.
- The major legislation to be introduced in this Session of Parliament includes:
- Amendments to further improve the quality of education in Victoria through the creation of self-governing schools;
- The repeal of the Retail Tenancies Act and delivery of a reform package for retail businesses which will give new rights to lessees and lessors;

- The sale of the National Rail Corporation, and provision for the establishment of a national track infrastructure body;
- Implementation of the Road Safety Committee report on the effect of drugs other than alcohol on road safety;
- A framework for the formation of catchment management authorities in each of Victoria's catchment and land protection regions; and
- The Budget which, as an initiative of this Government, is now brought down in the first half of the year to enable work to begin on new projects and programs from July 1.
- Parliament, as the supreme law giving body of the State, is requested to grant the essential passage of the legislation put before it to provide the necessary leadership and support to Victorians in their quest for future opportunity and ensure we are able to maintain the ideal of living in Victoria.
- The preceding Session of the 53rd Parliament of Victoria was opened by my predecessor, the Honourable Richard E. McGarvie, AC, who retired in April last year and to whom I pay tribute for the distinguished manner in which he served the Crown and the State.
- It is with deep regret I advise that since the Parliament was last opened, six former members have died: the Honourable William Montgomery Campbell, MLC for East Yarra, Deputy President and Chairman of Committees; the Honourable Andrew Arthur Hughes, MLA for Caulfield; the Honourable Charles James Murphy, MLA for Hawthorn; the Honourable John Joseph Jones, MLC for Ballarat; the Honourable Leslie George Norman, MLA for Glen Iris, and served as Government Whip, Minister Without Portfolio and Leader of the Liberal-Country Party; and the Honourable Kevin Myles Stephen Holland, MLA for Flemington.
- I charge Government Ministers and Members of both Houses to continue providing good government in such a way that honours the integrity of the Parliament and our unique democracy in the equal interests of all Victorians.
- I now formally open this Parliament and pray that the guidance of Almighty God may attend your deliberations.

 - 4. Government Business Notices of Motion
 - Government Business Orders of the Day.
 - Notwithstanding Sessional Order No. 2 -
 - (1) So much of Standing Order No. 124 as allows Members to ask oral questions without notice at the time of giving notices of motion be suspended and that Members ask oral questions without notice at 2.00 p.m each sitting day (other than on a Tuesday where a motion expressing sorrow at the death of a Member or any other person may take precedence): Provided that these Sessional Orders shall not permit more than one question time each sitting day.
 - (2) At 2.00 p.m. on each sitting day (other than a Tuesday) Mr Speaker shall interrupt the business before the House, or if the House be in Committee, the Chairman shall report progress and Mr Speaker shall then interrupt such business: provided that in the event that a Division is in progress at 2.00 p.m. such Division shall be completed and the result announced and if such Division be upon a closure motion any question required to be brought to conclusion as a result of such Division shall be so brought to conclusion.
 - (3) Any business under discussion and not disposed of at 2.00 p.m shall be resumed immediately at the conclusion of the asking of oral questions and any Member speaking at the time of interruption may, upon the resumption of debate thereon, continue such speech.
 - 4.(1) Standing Order No. 59 be suspended and, notwithstanding Sessional Order No. 2, the first Order of the Day on Wednesdays appointed by resolution of the House shall be the question "That grievances be noted", to which question any Member may

speak for not more than fifteen minutes and the whole discussion on this question shall end at 2.00 p.m.

- (2) On those appointed Wednesdays, business shall be called on in the following order:
 - Grievances
 - 2. Oral Questions (At 2.00 p.m)
 - Government Business
 - 4. General Business
- 5. Notwithstanding the right of a Minister to move a motion for the adjournment of the House pursuant to Standing Order No. 25 -
 - (1) At 10.00 p.m. on each sitting day Mr Speaker shall interrupt the business before the House, or if the House be in Committee, the Chairman shall report progress and Mr Speaker shall then interrupt such business: provided that in the event that a Division is in progress at 10.00 p.m. such Division shall be completed and the result announced and if such Division be upon a closure motion any question required to be brought to conclusion as a result of such Division shall be so brought to conclusion.
 - (2) Upon such interruption of business -
 - (a) Before a motion for the adjournment is proposed by Mr Speaker, a Minister may move that the sitting be continued; which motion shall be put forthwith without amendment or debate and if such motion is agreed to, the House or Committee shall resume the proceedings at the point at which they had been interrupted; or
 - (b) If a Minister does not so move, Mr Speaker shall forthwith propose the question "That the House do now adjourn" which question shall be open to debate in accordance with the rules and practices of the House and paragraph (4); at the conclusion of the debate, Mr Speaker notwithstanding the provisions of Standing Order No. 24 shall adjourn the House without putting any question until the time of the next meeting.
 - (3) Any business under discussion and not disposed of at the time of the adjournment shall be set down on the Notice Paper for the next sitting and any Member speaking at the time of interruption may, upon the resumption of debate thereon, continue such speech.
 - (4) On the motion "That the House do now adjourn" the time available for the raising of matters on the motion be 30 minutes and the time limit per member be three minutes.
- 6.(1) Standing Orders shall be suspended to allow for the programming of Government Business and the following procedures.
 - (2) Before the House meets for business in any week, the Leader of the House and the Deputy Leader of the Opposition (or their nominees) may meet as a Government Business Programming Committee with a view to reaching agreement on the manner in which the House is to deal with Government Business of the week.
 - (3) On the first day of the sitting week the Leader of the House or his nominee before the calling on of Government Business may move without leave a motion setting a date and time by which consideration of specified Bills or items of business have to be completed in that sitting week. Debate thereon shall not exceed thirty minutes and, in speaking thereon no Member shall exceed five minutes.

- (4) At a change of business, following a special meeting of the Government Business Programming Committee convened in accordance with the aims of sub-paragraph (2), and without leave, the Leader of the House or his nominee may move a motion to amend the resolution under sub-paragraph (3). Debate thereon shall not exceed thirty minutes and, in speaking thereon no Member shall exceed five minutes. Any change to the programme cannot come into operation until one hour after the motion is agreed to.
- (5) Amendments to be proposed in Committee of the Whole to a specified Bill may be circulated in the House during the debate on the question "That this Bill be now read a second time" after an announcement and request of a Minister or a Member (without leave but not when another Member is speaking) foreshadowing such amendments: Provided that these amendments are circulated two hours before the expiration of the completion time set under sub-paragraph (3). Such announcement and request shall not be debated.
- (6) On the expiration of the completion time set under sub-paragraph (3), the Chair, in relation to a specified motion, shall put forthwith the question on any amendment and/or motion already proposed from the Chair for the purpose of bringing to a conclusion any proceedings on the motion.
- (7) On the expiration of the completion time set under sub-paragraph (3), the Chair, in relation to a specified Bill, shall put forthwith the question on any amendment or motion already proposed from the Chair for the purpose of bringing to a conclusion any proceedings on the Bill and -
 - (a) as required, the remaining questions necessary for the passage of the Bill through the House and transmission to the Legislative Council shall be combined (except in the case of a Bill that requires the second reading and third reading to be passed with an absolute majority of the whole number of the Members of the Legislative Assembly, the questions for the second and third readings shall be put separately), the Committee stage of a Bill being dispensed with if no Government amendments have been circulated pursuant to sub-paragraph (5); and
 - (b) in the case of the consideration of any Bill in Committee of the Whole or on any of the remaining stages at that time, the Chair shall put a combined question or a number of questions (the form and number being at the discretion of the Chair) disposing of any clauses and schedules and any amendment and new clauses and schedules desired by the Government copies of which have been circulated in the House pursuant to sub-paragraph (5) - and any other questions required to dispose of the Bill (as the case may be) before the Committee of the Whole or the House. (No other amendments, new clauses or schedules shall be proposed); and
- (8) After the House has concluded the proceedings under sub-paragraph (6) or (7), in the case of each remaining specified Bill or item of Government Business, the Chair shall -
 - (i) in the case of a Bill, put in a combined question, as required, the questions necessary for the passage of the Bill through the House and transmission to the Legislative Council (including any amendments and new clauses and schedules desired by the Government which have been circulated pursuant to sub-paragraph (5)), the Committee stage being dispensed with; and
 - (ii) in the case of a Bill that requires the second reading and third reading to be passed with an absolute majority of the whole number of the Members of the Legislative Assembly, put separately the questions necessary for the passage

- of the Bill through the House and transmission to the Legislative Council, (including a combined question relating to any amendments and new clauses and schedules desired by the Government which have been circulated pursuant to sub-paragraph (5)), the Committee stage being dispensed with; and
- (iii) in relation to any Bill being considered in the Committee of the Whole, put a combined question or a number of questions (the form and number being at the discretion of the Chair) disposing of any clauses and schedules and any amendment and new clauses and schedules desired by the Government copies of which have been circulated in the House pursuant to sub-paragraph (5) and any other questions required to dispose of the Bill (as the case may be) before the Committee of the Whole or the House. (No other amendments, new clauses or schedules shall be proposed); and
- (iv) in the case of a remaining item of business other than a Bill, put a combined question (if required) which brings to a conclusion the proceedings.
- (9) If, on the expiration of the completion time set under sub-paragraph (3), the House or Committee is considering a non-specified motion or Bill, and there are specified motions or Bills to be completed, Mr Speaker shall interrupt the business before the House, or if the House be in Committee, the Chairman shall report progress and Mr Speaker shall then interrupt such business: provided that in the event that a Division is in progress such Division shall be completed and the result announced and if such Division be upon a closure motion any question required to be brought to conclusion as a result of such Division shall be so brought to conclusion. The House shall then consider such motions or Bills as required by sub-paragraph (8). At the completion of such motions or Bills the House or Committee shall immediately resume the interrupted business and any Member speaking at the time of interruption may, upon the resumption of debate thereon, continue such speech.
- (10) The Chair shall not accept any points of order once the expiration of the completion time under sub-paragraph (3) has arrived and until all the required questions under sub-paragraph (6), (7) or (8) have been dealt with.
- (11) Standing and/or Sessional Orders relating to closure of debate or guillotine shall not apply to any proceedings in respect of a specified Bill or item of business.

 - (4) That so much of the Standing Orders be suspended so as to allow the following to apply:
 - a member may ask a question without notice from the time the Speaker calls for questions. Questions without notice may be asked for 1 hour on each sitting day. However, the Speaker may extend the time for Ouestions without notice at his or her discretion;
 - (b) the Speaker may require the language of a question to be changed if it seems to him or her that it is unbecoming or is in breach of the Standing Orders or conventions of the House;
 - a member asking a question must not offer argument or an opinion on the matter; or give facts or names of persons, except those strictly necessary to explain the question;
 - (d) when a member gives facts or names, he or she is responsible for their accuracy. Where the matter is of sufficient importance, the Speaker may require prima facie proof of accuracy;

 - (f) a Minister may decline to answer a question or part of a question:
 - (i) on the ground of public policy; or
 - (ii) if the Minister is unable to answer the question fully and accurately without notice and requests that the question or part of the question be placed upon the Notice Paper; or
 - (iii) if the Minister informs the House that the question requires a more extensive answer than is appropriate to a question without notice and that it will be the subject of a Ministerial statement or announcement at an early opportunity.

- 7. Omit sub-paragraph 4(1) and sub-paragraph 4(2) and insert the following paragraph: "4. That so much of standing order no 59 be suspended so as to allow that on those Thursdays, business shall be called on in the following order:

 - (ii) sound and/or visual transmissions or broadcasts of, or sound and/or visual broadcasts or re-broadcasts of recordings of anything occurring in

the Legislative Assembly chamber prior to the time fixed for the meeting of the House or after the adjournment of the House;

- (2) the following conditions be required to be observed by media organisations making sound and/or visual transmissions or broadcasts from the Legislative Assembly chamber or sound and/or visual broadcasts or re-broadcasts of recordings of proceedings of the Legislative Assembly pursuant to paragraph (1)(d) and any breach of the exceptions and these conditions may result in the immediate suspension of privileges by Mr Speaker:
 - (a) Media organisations or individuals must be accredited by Mr Speaker.
 - (b) Sound shall be recorded only from the audio signal of proceedings transmitted by the House monitoring system by representatives of accredited media organisations or individuals. No alteration to the sound relay equipment is permitted without the permission of Mr Speaker. The use of separate recording equipment is not permitted unless authorised by Mr Speaker.
 - (c) Visual and/or sound recordings and excerpts of visual and/or sound recordings shall not commence until the conclusion of the prayer and shall be used only for the purposes of fair and accurate reports of proceedings and reasonable balance between both sides of the House is to be achieved by avoiding undue concentration on any one Member.
 - (d) Visual and/or sound recordings and excerpts of visual and/or sound recordings shall not be used for:
 - (i) political party advertising or election campaigns; or
 - (ii) satire or ridicule; or
 - (iii) commercial sponsorship or commercial advertising; or
 - (iv) television advertisements or promotion.
 - (e) Visual and/or sound recording of any particular proceeding must provide equality between Government and Non-government Members.
 - (f) Visual and/or sound transmissions or broadcasts of, or broadcasts or rebroadcasts of recordings of, proceedings shall be such as to provide in context a balanced presentation of differing views and may not include the transmission or broadcast of, or broadcast or re-broadcast of a recording of events in the chamber unrelated to the proceedings of the House.
 - (g) Visual and/or sound excerpts of recordings of proceedings must be placed in context. Commentators should identify Members at least by name.
 - (h) Visual and/or sound excerpts of recordings of proceedings shall not misrepresent any proceeding before the House, or the seating position, or office held by any Member of the House.
 - (i) When making visual and/or sound transmissions or recordings, camera operators shall operate within the guidelines issued by the Speaker.

In many ways this decision would have been easy to make in the aftermath of the 1992 defeat. I believed however, it was important that some members of the Cain Kirner governments remain to defend the vision, achievements and plain decency of those governments. Furthermore I wished to contribute to the remaking of Labor's policy platform and believe the Financial Management, Industry Development and social justice document 'The Victoria Charter' provided a substantial basis for this on going process.

Since 1978 it has been my great privilege to serve the Australian Labor Party as candidate, adviser and Member of Parliament. I have held the portfolios of Housing and Construction, Finance and Treasury and during my time in office I was associated, sometimes in a modest way, at other times as sole architect with a wide range of policy initiatives. I note the current governments acknowledgment in recent Treasury papers that its own financial management reform program began with the Independent Review of Victoria's Public Sector Finances that I initiated in 1992. To this may well have been added the establishment of the Treasury Corporation of Victoria, the introduction of accrual accounting and the Public Sector Financial Management Act.

My greatest privilege however, has been to work with members of the Labor Party, and the wider Northcote community. Together we pioneered the first environmental employment scheme in Victoria, assisted in the development of many local education projects and created an electorate office that was a genuine community resource.

I would like to take this opportunity to extend my best wishes to all Members of Parliament. The privilege has been mine.

- (3) If the Committee decides to consider a submission under this Sessional Order, the Committee may confer with the person who made the submission and any Member who referred in the House to that person.
- (4) In considering a submission under this Sessional Order, the Committee shall meet in private session.
- (5) The Committee shall not publish a submission referred to it under this Sessional Order or its proceedings in relation to such a submission, but may present minutes of its proceedings and all or part of such submission to the House.

- (6) In considering a submission under this Sessional Order and reporting to the House the Committee shall not consider or judge the truth or any statements made in the House or Committee of the Whole House or of the submission.
- (7) In its report to the House on a submission under this Sessional Order, the Committee may make either of the following recommendations -
 - (a) that no further action be taken by the House or by the Committee in relation to the submission: or
 - (b) that a response by the person who made the submission, in terms specified in the report and agreed to by the person and the Committee, be published by the House or incorporated in Hansard -

and shall not make any other recommendations.

 - (a) in the case of a response by a person who made a submission, shall be succinct and strictly relevant to the questions in issue and shall not contain anything offensive in character; and

- (3) The publication of the report of the Commissioners in accordance with this section is absolutely privileged and the provisions of sections 73 and 74 of the Constitution Act 1975 and any other enactment or rule of law relating to the publication of the proceedings of the Parliament apply to and in relation to the publication of the report as if it were a report to which those sections applied and had been published by the Government Printer under the authority of the Parliament.

THE VICTORIAN HEALTH PROMOTION FOUNDATION

The Members of the Legislative Council and the Members of the Legislative Assembly having assembled in the Legislative Assembly Chamber pursuant to resolutions of the two Houses —

- 1 ELECTION OF PRESIDENT The Honourable P.N. Honeywood, MP moved That the Honourable Bruce Anthony Chamberlain, MLC, President of the Legislative Council, be appointed President of this Joint Sitting which motion having been seconded by Mr S.P. Bracks, MP, was resolved in the affirmative.
 - The Honourable Bruce Anthony Chamberlain, MLC, having expressed his acknowledgement of the honour conferred upon him by the Joint Sitting, then took the Chair.
- 2 RULES OF PROCEDURE The President announced that section 21 of the Tobacco Act 1987 provides that the Joint Sitting shall be conducted in accordance with rules adopted for the purpose by Members at the sitting. Accordingly, the Honourable P.N. Honeywood, MP submitted the following rules of procedure for the consideration of Honourable Members, and moved That these rules be the rules of procedure for this Joint Sitting:
 - 1. On any debate arising the same shall be conducted according to Parliamentary usage.

- A Member, addressing the President, shall propose a Member or Members to be elected and any such proposal shall be duly seconded. When each Member is so proposed, the proposer shall state that such Member is willing to be so elected, if chosen.
- If no more than the required number of Members are proposed and seconded, the President shall declare such Members as having been elected.
- 4. If more than the required number of Members are proposed and seconded in respect of the vacancies the Members to be elected shall be chosen by ballot in the manner prescribed by rules 5 to 8, inclusive.
- 5. In the ballot for the vacancies, the President shall announce the names of the Members proposed and shall cause each Member present to be provided with a ballot paper initialled by the Clerk of each House. Each Member shall write on such ballot paper the names of the Members that the Member voting wishes to be elected; and if any ballot paper contains more than the appropriate number of names, it shall be rejected. Having marked the ballot paper as provided, the Member voting shall place it in a ballot box provided for the purpose.
- 6. The President shall appoint three Members to be scrutineers, who, with one of the Clerks, shall ascertain the number of votes for each Member. The required number of Members reported to have the greatest number of votes shall be deemed to be duly elected. In case of doubt arising through two or more Members having an equality of votes, the scrutineers, by drawing lots, shall determine which of such Members has been duly elected.
- 7. No informal vote shall be taken into account.
- 8. The President shall be entitled to a vote.
- 9. As soon as a ballot has been concluded the President shall declare
 - "That have been elected to the Victorian Health Foundation".
- 10. The President shall advise the responsible Minister of the Members elected.
- 11. The records of the proceedings and the ballot papers shall be retained by the Clerk of the Parliaments who shall be the custodian thereof and shall keep the ballot papers safely for one year and thereafter destroy them.

Mr S.P. Bracks, MP, seconded the motion.

Question — put and resolved in the affirmative.

VICTORIAN HEALTH PROMOTION FOUNDATION — The President announced that he was now prepared to receive proposals from Honourable Members with regard to two members to be elected to the Victorian Health Promotion Foundation.

The Honourable P.N. Honeywood, MP proposed that the Honourable Gerald Barry Ashman, MLC, and Mrs Janet Tindale Calder Wilson, MP be elected to the Victorian

Health Promotion Foundation, and stated that they were willing to be elected, if chosen; which proposal was seconded by Mr S.P. Bracks, MP.

The President asked if there were any further proposals and, there being no further proposals, thereupon declared that the Honourable Gerald Barry Ashman, MLC, and Mrs Janet Tindale Calder Wilson, MP, had been elected.

The President declared the Joint Sitting closed.
