The above Abstract does not include any part of the Expenses of the General Government. The proportion of such expenses chargeable to the Port Phillip District for the thirteen years ended 31st December, 1848, has been estimated by the New South Wales Government in a Return to that date, to amount to £86,280, or an average of about £6,635 a year; making for the entire period to 30th June, 1851, a sum of £102,842.

In consequence of a change in the system of keeping the Public Accounts from 1st. January, 1850, the Expenditure of that year includes a considerable amount of Arrear Expenses of 1849. The amount stated for 1849 in the above Abstract contains not more than eleven months Expenditure.
