REPORT.

The Joint Select Committee appointed by both Houses of Parliament, during the present Session, have the honor to report that they have agreed to the following resolutions :—

1. That the trenched ground now being planted in the Parliamentary Reserve, should for the present be closed to the public, but that the keys of the gates should be placed in the custody of the Assistant Librarian, and of the housekeepers of both Houses, for the use of Members.

2. That the planted ground ought, in the opinion of the Committee, to be enclosed by an ornamental iron fence, to be approved of by the Committee.

3. That the Commissioner of Police be requested to direct the Police officers to protect the grounds from the intrusion of the public, as recommended in the foregoing resolutions.

4. The Committee regret to find that no steps have yet been taken in relation to the ventilation of the Legislative Chamber.
