¹ This column presents a statement of the average numbers attending at one service only on the Sabbath, and it has been pointed out that this mode of calculating the attendance does not render the returns of the different denominations strictly comparable, inasmuch as, in connection with some religious bodies, there are several services held on the same day, at each of which an entirely distinct set of worshippers attends, whilst, in the case of other denominations, the attendance at subsequent services always consists, to a greater or less extent, of the same individuals as were comprised in the first congregation.—² These figures are copied from the returns furnished for the year 1871, as the statistics of the Presbyterian Church of Victoria are, in future, to be collected biennially.—³ These figures are only to be taken as approximate, some of the churches not having furnished returns.

¹ In connexion with the Melbourne Grammar School there is an exhibition of £21, tenable for three years, which is awarded annually to a boy under 14, for education in the school; also one of £20, given annually for three years to a student who is going to attend the University.—² At the Geelong Grammar School there are now three students under education as exhibitioners from Common Schools.—³ In connexion with the Scotch College there is an exhibition of £21, tenable for two years, annually open for competition to boys under 14 years of age. The successful candidate is required to attend the classes of the college.—⁴ In connexion with the Wesley College there is a scholarship called the "Draper scholarship," which has been established in memory of the late Rev. D. J. Draper, who perished in the *London*. It is of the value of £25, tenable for one year. Accepted candidates for the Wesleyan Ministry form a distinct division, but their admission is only a provisional arrangement awaiting the proposed establishment of a Theological Institution.
