<sup>1</sup> This column presents a statement of the average numbers attending at one service only on the Sabbath, and it has been pointed out that this mode of calculating the attendance does not render the returns of the different denominations strictly comparable, inasmuch as, in connection with some religious bodies, there are several services held on the same day, at each of which an entirely distinct set of worshippers attends, whilst, in the case of other denominations, the attendance at subsequent services always consists, to a greater or less extent, of the same individuals as were comprised in the first congregation.

<sup>1</sup> In connexion with the Melbourne Grammar School there is an exhibition of £21, tenable for three years, which is awarded annually to a boy under 14, for education in the school; also one of £20, given annually for two years to a student who is going to attend the University.—<sup>2</sup> At the Geelong Grammar School there are now three students under education as exhibitioners from Common Schools.—<sup>3</sup> In connexion with the Scotch College there is an exhibition of £21, tenable for two years, annually open for competition to boys under 14 years of age. The successful candidate is required to attend the classes of the college.—<sup>4</sup> In connexion with the Wesley College there is a scholarship called the "Draper scholarship," which has been established in memory of the late Rev. D. J. Draper, who perished in the London. It is of the value of £25, tenable for one year. Two other scholarships have also been lately founded by Mrs. Powell, to be called the "Walter Powell Scholarships," in memory of her late husband. They are of the value of £40 each, payable in two annual instalments of £20. Accepted candidates for the Wesleyan Ministry form a distinct division, but their admission is only a provisional arrangement awaiting the proposed establishment of a Theological Institution.

NOTE.—The large increase in the number of scholars in Public Schools shown in the returns for 1869, 1870, 1871, and 1872, as compared with previous years, is partly owing to the fact that, in the figures supplied by the Education Office prior to those years, the average monthly number of children on the Rolls was given; whereas, for 1869, 1870, 1871, and 1872 the total numbers who attended the schools were returned. It was mentioned in a footnote to the Table of Common Schools *ante* that a correction applied for the children who attended at more than one school during 1872 would reduce the number shown in the Table (135,962) to 118,498 as the number of distinct children who attended Common Schools in the year. In the "Statistics for 1868" it was in like manner stated that the number of distinct children who attended Common Schools in that year was 101,925; in the "Statistics for 1869" the number was stated to be 106,079; in the "Statistics for 1870" the number was stated to be 107,537; and in the "Statistics for 1871" the number was stated to be 114,300.
