PRESENTED TO BOTH HOUSES OF PARLIAMENT BY HIS EXCELLENCY'S COMMAND.

TRANSMISSION OF STATE WAR TELEGRAMS TO COUNTRY NEWSPAPERS ON SUNDAY AT ORDINARY PRESS RATES.

THE Governor in Council has been pleased to approve that in future all State War Telegrams received on Sunday be transmitted on the same day from Melbourne to Country Newspapers, and at the same rates as are now charged on ordinary Press Messages sent by Telegraph within Victoria, viz. :—
