PRESS AND PRIVATE INTERCOLONIAL MESSAGES.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

PRESENTED TO BOTH HOUSES OF PARLIAMENT BY HIS EXCELLENCY'S COMMAND.

CHARGE FOR INTERCOLONIAL MESSAGES TRANSMITTED AFTER OFFICE HOURS
BETWEEN THE COLONIES OF VICTORIA, NEW SOUTH WALES, AND SOUTH
AUSTRALIA.

THE Governor in Council has been pleased to approve of the following arrangements being entered into between the Administrations of the Colonies of Victoria, New South Wales, and South Australia, to take effect from the 1st July 1878 :—

After office hours the charge for Intercolonial Messages (press and private), with the exception of English Mail Reports, to be 50 per cent. on the ordinary rates. On Sunday, the minimum charge for Private Messages to be as follows :—

For ten words and under	Five shillings.
For each additional word	Fourpence.
