ORDER IN COUNCIL.

PRESENTED TO BOTH HOUSES OF PARLIAMENT BY HIS EXCELLENCY'S COMMAND.

RATES CHARGEABLE ON MESSAGES TRANSMITTED BETWEEN CERTAIN BORDER
TOWNS IN VICTORIA AND NEW SOUTH WALES.

THE Governor in Council has been pleased to approve of the following reduced rates being charged, on and after the 4th September 1878, on Telegraphic Messages transmitted between the undermentioned border towns in Victoria and New South Wales :—

Between Wodonga, Wahgunyah, and Echuca, in Victoria, to any part of New South Wales ; and between Albury, Corowa, Moama, and Howlong, in New South Wales, to any part of Victoria :—

Not exceeding ten words	One shilling.
For each additional word	One penny.
