YEA RAILWAY—JUNCTION AT TALLAROOK.—Mr. Gavan Duffy moved, pursuant to *amended* notice, That a Select Committee be appointed to enquire into and report upon the subject of the junction of the proposed Yea railway at Tallarook; such Committee to consist of Mr. R. Clark, Mr. O'Callaghan, Mr. Gillies, Mr. Hall, Mr. Shiels, Mr. Hunt, Mr. Patterson, and the Mover, three to form a quorum; with power to call for persons and papers, and that the Petition presented to this House on the 2nd May last be referred to the Committee.  
Debate ensued.  
Question—put and resolved in the affirmative.
