PRESENTED TO BOTH HOUSES OF PARLIAMENT BY HIS EXCELLENCY'S COMMAND.

REDUCED RATES ON MESSAGES SENT FROM VICTORIA TO TASMANIA.

THE Governor in Council has been pleased to approve of the following reduced rates being charged, on and after the 1st September 1883, on messages sent from Victoria to Tasmania.

PRIVATE MESSAGES.

For ten words or under	Two shillings.
Each additional word	Two pence.

PRESS MESSAGES.

For one hundred words or under	Three shillings and sixpence.
Each additional fifty words or under	Two shillings.

The address and signature of the telegrams to be sent free if they do not together exceed ten words ; each word above that number to be charged for at the above-mentioned rates.
