EDUCATION ACT 1872—REGULATION—RELIGIOUS
INSTRUCTION IN STATE SCHOOLS.

Ordered by the Legislative Assembly to be printed, 3rd November, 1883.

REGULATION UNDER "THE EDUCATION ACT 1872."

WHEREAS by the 18th section of *The Education Act 1872* it was enacted that the Governor in Council might, from time to time, make and rescind regulations for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth, by this Order, make the following additional Regulation, that is to say:—

REGULATION XVI.—RELIGIOUS INSTRUCTION IN STATE SCHOOLS.

For the purpose of affording increased facilities for giving religious instruction in State schools the ordinary school business shall, in one or two days in each week, as the Board of Advice may determine, terminate at half-past Three o'clock p.m.

On these occasions the teachers shall, immediately after announcing the dismissal of the school for the day, give notice that all pupils whose parents do not object to their receiving religious instruction may remain for that purpose.
