RE-DIRECTION OF TELEGRAMS WITHIN VICTORIA.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

PRESENTED TO BOTH HOUSES OF PARLIAMENT BY HIS EXCELLENCY'S COMMAND.

RATES CHARGEABLE ON TELEGRAMS RE-DIRECTED FROM THE ORIGINAL ADDRESS, AND FORWARDED BY TELEGRAPH TO ANY OTHER ADDRESS WITHIN VICTORIA.

THE Governor in Council has been pleased to approve that Telegrams directed to any place within Victoria may, on written request of the addressees, be forwarded by telegraph to any other address within the colony, at half Victorian rates (but in no case must the charge be less than Sixpence), exclusive of the original fee paid and contingent charges for portage, &c. Charges for re-transmission may be paid in advance or collected on delivery.
