- (1.) No correspondence passed between the Government and the Commissioners on the subject. The Commissioners acted on the resolution of the Legislative Assembly.
- (2.) Four trains each way between Prince's Bridge and Oakleigh.
Three trains each way between Prince's Bridge and Mordialloc.
Seven trains each way between Spencer-street and Coburg.
Five trains each way between Camberwell and Box Hill.
The number of passengers conveyed, exclusive of holders of periodical tickets, was, from 18th January to 15th June, 69,504.
- (3.) The total expenditure in connection with these trains was £1,179 6 5
And the revenue 1,580 5 2
Leaving a balance of profit amounting to 400 18 9
