RATES CHARGEABLE ON PRESS TELEGRAMS FROM VICTORIA TO NEW SOUTH
 WALES AND SOUTH AUSTRALIA.

THE Governor in Council has been pleased to approve of the following rates being charged, from 1st December, 1886, upon Press Messages sent by Telegraph from Victoria to any Telegraph Office in New South Wales or South Australia (with the exception of Offices upon the Port Darwin line in the latter Colony), viz. :—

Each additional fifty words	1	6

The proper authorities in New South Wales and South Australia have agreed to a similar charge being levied upon like Messages sent from those Colonies to Victoria.
