THE Governor in Council has been pleased to approve that from the 1st May, 1887, the charges for transmission by wire over the Telegraph Lines of Victoria and New South Wales of Intercolonial Press Messages for and from New Zealand shall be:—

The above fees to be in addition to the charges for transmission of such Messages between New South Wales and New Zealand.
