

CHARGES, ETC., FOR SUBURBAN TELEPHONE EXCHANGES.

THE Administrator of the Government has been pleased to approve of the undermentioned charges in connexion with Suburban Telephone Exchanges, viz.:—

Magneto-extension bells, each ... ..	0 10 0

Special appliances as per agreement.	

The above rates include attendance, adjustment, repairs, and renewal of instruments and batteries.

Mileage to be calculated radially from the Exchange with which the lessee's premises are connected as the centre.

Rent to be charged from the first day of the month following the completion of the line.

Rent to be paid in advance, yearly, half-yearly, or quarterly, at the option of the lessee, but the first year's rent must be paid before any connexion is made.

New lines to be taken for at least one year.

One calendar month's notice in writing must be given of intention to discontinue the use of a line.

Lessees requiring their wires or instruments removed from one building or room to another will be charged the net cost of labour and material expended on such removal.

If the removal involves an extension of line beyond the mileage paid for, the rental will be increased accordingly.
