FISHERIES ACT 1873.—NOTICE.

PRESENTED TO BOTH HOUSES OF PARLIAMENT PURSUANT TO SECTION 4 OF ACT No. 622.

IT is hereby notified for general information that it is intended, at the expiration of one month from this date, to move His Excellency the Administrator of the Government in Council to make, under the powers conferred by the *Fisheries Act 1873*, a Proclamation prohibiting the use of any fixed trammel, trawl, or other net or engine to be employed in fishing between the first day of January and the thirty-first day of December inclusive in each year, within the Merri River, Lady Bay, and in that portion of water within a quarter of a mile of the mouth of the said river.
