# REPORT.

---

## TO THE HONORABLE THE CHIEF SECRETARY.

The Public Library at the end of 1889 contained 118,556 volumes and 134,148 pamphlets and parts, 3,688 volumes having been added during the year. Of these 1,897 volumes were donations, 1,743 were purchased, and 48 were received under the provisions of the Copyright Act. The Trustees are indebted to the British Government for a valuable donation, consisting of 846 volumes, 2,458 pamphlets, and 5,186 maps; and to the Indian, Foreign, and Colonial Governments for their usual important contributions. Their thanks are also due to Professor Giglioli, of Florence, for a gift of 65 volumes and 262 pamphlets

The collection of newspapers was largely increased, no less than 34,198 papers having been added during the year.

The progress of the new catalogue has been retarded by various causes, but efforts are being made to ensure its speedy completion.

Arrangements were completed at the commencement of the year for lighting the Library from the central station of the New Australian Electric Company, with the result that the light has been greatly improved and the risk of fire diminished.

The Technological and Industrial Museum has made very satisfactory progress, a large number of specimens having been acquired during the year by purchase, donation, and exchange.

A further instalment of the register of the Natural History Museum has been furnished by the Director, showing that 53,601 specimens have been catalogued, classified, and fully labelled.

Three oil paintings were purchased during the year for the National Gallery from the collection at the Centennial International Exhibition. Some valuable pictures were also presented, of which the following are the most important:—

“After the Massacre of Glencoe,” by Peter Graham, R.A. Presented by James Graham, Esq.

“Summer Morning in North Wales,” by Edwin Ellis. Presented by David Beath, Esq.

“Langley Dell,” by D. C. Hunt. Presented by Robert Litton, Esq.

Portraits of Sir Richard Steele and Sir Charles Darling were presented by the Hon. W. A. C. a'Beckett, and three pictures were given by the late Canon Bromby, D.D.

The Trustees have received from Mr. John Longstaff his first copy of an old master, under the terms of the travelling scholarship awarded to him in 1887. The work, which is a copy of the “Entombment of Christ,” by Titian, was painted from the original in the Louvre.

Briton Rivière's picture, entitled “Deer Stealers pursued by Sleuth Hounds,” which hung in the gallery for many years, has been sent to London for sale, as the Trustees consider that, having obtained a far better example of his work in “A Roman Holiday,” the money can be spent more advantageously in another direction.

Much attention has been given to the great importance of securing the buildings and collections as far as possible from the risk of fire. With this view, the Trustees

invited reports from Superintendent Stein and the architects as to the most effective precautions that could be taken, and their recommendations are being carried out as speedily as possible.

The Trustees were pleased to learn that the Government had decided to provide the sum of £90,000 for the extension of the buildings, as increased accommodation is urgently needed for all departments of the Institution.

The fullest consideration has been given to the plans in order that the money may be spent to the greatest possible advantage. It has been decided to proceed at once with the erection of buildings which will provide accommodation for two Sculpture Galleries and a Technological Museum, and it is hoped that the Government will place on the Estimates for the coming year the sum of £43,000, necessary to complete this portion of the work.

The trustees are highly gratified to find that their efforts to render the Public Library, Museums, and National Gallery useful and attractive to the public have been so well appreciated, that no less than 754,943 persons visited these institutions during 1889, showing a large increase over the number of visitors in any previous year.

Before closing this report the Trustees desire to record their sense of the great loss which the Public Library, Museums, and National Gallery have sustained by the death of Sir William F. Stawell, K.C.M.G., who was for 35 years a Trustee of these Institutions.

**REPORT OF THE LIBRARIAN TO THE COMMITTEE OF THE  
PUBLIC LIBRARY FOR THE YEAR 1889.**

The Public Library,  
25th March, 1890.

I have the honour to lay before the Library Committee the following Report for the year 1889.

1. The additions to the Library during the years 1888 and 1889 were:—

The diminution in the number of volumes added to the Library, as compared with 1888, is chiefly due to the fact that in the latter year the institution received the magnificent donation of the private library of the late Sir John O'Shanassy from his son Matthew O'Shanassy, Esq. The additions, however, compare very favourably with those of any previous year.

The purchases were many and important, particular attention having been paid to special departments, as those of History, Social Science, and Arts and Trades.

Forty-eight volumes, 87 maps and plans, and 21,325 newspapers were acquired under the provisions of the Copyright Act.

The donations, moreover, were very satisfactory, and the Governments of Great Britain, United States, Canada, the Australian Colonies, and India, and those of Germany, France, and Belgium, continue to prove their interest in the institution by the liberality of their gifts.

Amongst the contributions from private individuals may be mentioned 65 volumes and 262 pamphlets, which are all of considerable importance, the gift of Professor Giglioli, of Florence.

2. At the end of the year under review the Library contained 118,556 volumes, and 134,148 pamphlets and parts.

3. The amount spent in the purchase of books was £1,693 9s. 7d., as against £1,636 16s. 8d. spent in 1888; and in bookbinding £934 0s. 9d., as against £936 4s. 6d. of the previous year; 1,010 volumes were bound, and 739 repaired.

4. The total additions to the periodical and newspaper rooms were 18,277 pamphlets and parts, and 34,198 newspapers respectively, showing a considerable increase on the previous years; 1,439 newspapers were procured by purchase, 11,434 by donation, and 21,325 under the provisions of the Copyright Act.

5. The new catalogue has made fair progress, but its completion has been retarded owing to various causes, chiefly due to changes in the staff, and the little assistance obtainable from men who are entirely inexperienced in such work.

6. The floor of the reading-rooms has been covered with kamptulicon in place of the matting previously used, and the superiority of the former has already made itself felt in the additional cleanliness of the Library and the better preservation of the books.

7. Eighty-five Government publications were presented to 607 institutions and persons.

8. During the year 6,050 volumes were lent to 38 Free Libraries in the country districts.

9. The number of visits to the Library was 462,042, averaging nearly 1,500 a day, and showing an increase of 56,652 over the attendance of 1888.

In the Museum the whole foreign mineral collection has been re-arranged, the Department of Mines having handed over their valuable foreign collection for classification with that already in the Museum, the whole now making a most complete series, scientifically classified.

The section of Economic Botany is now being re-arranged, and largely added to by donations from the Agricultural Societies.

The laboratories have been attended by seventeen students, all of whom have made good progress, several having received good appointments.

SIR,

I have the honour to report that, during the past year, the foreign mineral collection has been re-arranged, and the collections of foreign minerals belonging to the Mining Department have been incorporated into it.

His Excellency Sir William Robinson, Acting-Governor, presented a handsomely framed and mounted photographic portrait of himself.

The Trustees have received from Mr. John Longstaff his first copy of an old master, under the terms of the travelling scholarship awarded to him in 1887. The cataloguing and arranging of the Art Museum is progressing satisfactorily, and Mr. Howitt is also of great assistance in classifying the collection of coins.

DIRECTOR'S PROGRESS REPORT OF THE NATIONAL MUSEUM  
FOR THE YEAR 1889.

*To the Chairman of the Committee of the National Museum.*

SIR,

I have the honour to forward the annual schedules of donations to the National Museum, marked A; of the specimens purchased in the colony, marked B; of the number of visitors, marked C; and of the exchanges, marked D.

That the institution still holds a place in the estimation of the public is shown in the recorded number of visitors for the year, 133,065, although from want of the completion of the building, the classification is now quite lost, and few of the specimens can be seen in many parts of the rooms and galleries.

The collections continue in as good order as is possible, with the want of the necessary space to allow of their proper inspection and preservation; but it has been impossible to prevent the distribution of many specimens, from this cause, which we can scarcely hope to replace.

The vacancy on the staff, caused by the retirement of the late John Leadbeater, had only recently been filled at the close of the period covered by this report, the new officer not arriving until after the year had closed. That the specimens should have continued in as satisfactory a condition as they have since my previous report is more than could have been expected, since the efficiency of a natural history collection can only be maintained by constant examination and treatment of the individual objects; and the natural difficulties have been intensified by the smallness of the staff and crowded condition of the specimens. It is now necessary to ask for the appointment of another assistant taxidermist to deal with the collections other than those of stuffed specimens. The great increase in the number of specimens renders it impossible to maintain the good condition of each without such further assistance.

The expectation expressed in my last report that the completion of the National Museum Building would have been carried out at once has not yet been realized, although the Government and Parliament took the necessary steps to provide the money, and the Public Works Department did what they could to give effect to my recommendations. If much more delay should take place, the vote will lapse, and still further irreparable damage to the collections will result.

A further instalment of the register of the contents of the National Museum is appended, reaching to number 53,601, specimens entered in the catalogue, and fully labelled and classified. Besides these and other specimens duly registered, a large number have also been named and arranged in the Museum, but not yet entered in the register.
