PUBLIC SERVICE ACT 1890, PART III.—REGULATIONS.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

PRESENTED TO BOTH HOUSES OF PARLIAMENT PURSUANT TO SECTION 23 OF
ACT No. 1086.

THE Governor in Council has approved the subjoined Regulation made by the Classifiers under the provisions of the *Public Service Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1133), Part III., section 68, in lieu of Regulation 1, Pupil Teachers, approved on the 6th October, 1890.

REGULATION.

WHEREAS by the *Public Service Act 1890*, section 68, it is enacted that the Classifiers may from time to time make and repeal, alter, and amend Regulations, which shall have full force and effect as soon as approved by the Governor in Council, for the following among other purposes:—

- (1) For determining the conditions to be fulfilled by candidates for the position of Pupil Teacher.

And whereas it is deemed expedient to alter and amend the conditions to be fulfilled by candidates for the position of Pupil Teacher:

Now therefore we, the undersigned, being the Members constituting the Committee of Classifiers, in pursuance of the said

powers, do hereby rescind Regulation 1, Pupil Teachers, and, in lieu thereof, make and declare the Regulation following, which shall have full force and effect as soon as approved by the Governor in Council:—

Pupil Teachers.

- (1) Candidates for appointment as Pupil Teachers must be not less than fourteen years of age, and must furnish satisfactory evidence of aptitude for teaching. Prior to appointment candidates must furnish certificates of good character, of sound constitution, and of freedom from any physical defect likely to impair their usefulness as teachers; and (1) must have passed fully in such of the subjects prescribed for the Fourth Class or some higher class in the course of Free Instruction Regulation 1 as are examined in individually; or (2) must have passed the Matriculation Examination of the University of Melbourne.
