TRANSMISSION OF SUNDAY TELEGRAMS.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

PRESENTED TO BOTH HOUSES OF PARLIAMENT BY HIS EXCELLENCY'S COMMAND.

RATES ON TELEGRAPHIC MESSAGES TRANSMITTED ON SUNDAYS BETWEEN VICTORIA AND QUEENSLAND.

THE Governor in Council has been pleased to approve that, pursuant to arrangements made with the Governments of New South Wales and Queensland, the following rates be chargeable on Telegraphic Messages transmitted from Victoria to Queensland on Sundays, from the 1st September, 1891 :—

Not exceeding Ten words	Six Shillings.
For each additional word	Sixpence.

The Charges collected on Messages, as above, to be equally divided between the Colonies of Victoria, New South Wales, and Queensland.
