RATES ON TELEGRAPHIC MESSAGES TRANSMITTED ON SUNDAYS BETWEEN  
 VICTORIA AND WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

THE Governor in Council has been pleased to approve that, pursuant to arrangements made with the Governments of South Australia and Western Australia, the following rates be chargeable on Telegraphic Messages transmitted from Victoria to Western Australia on Sundays, from 1st September, 1891:—

Not exceeding Ten words ...	...	...	...	Six Shillings.
For each additional word ...	...	...	...	Sixpence.

The Charges collected on Messages, as above, to be equally divided between the Colonies of Victoria, South Australia, and Western Australia.
