Trimnings, cashmere and French flannel (up to 9 inches in width).
Weights, for dresses (up to 1 oz. each).

Bags, Portmanteaux, and Trunks.

Rivets, washer head.

Boots and Shoes.

Caps, toe (metal).
Springs, for leggings.

Carriages.

Holders, rims, safety.

Hats and Caps.

Rims, wire.

Umbrellas, Parasols, and Sunshades.

Prevents.

Harness, Saddles, and Whips.

Rings, tinned.

Sundry.

Fittings, metal (for sword belts).
Rivets, screws (for letter clips).
Screws, band (for fastening saws).

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
