WHEREAS by the *Railways Standing Committee Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1177) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, on the recommendation of the Parliamentary Standing Committee on Railways, make, alter, or rescind all such Regulations as may be necessary or desirable for the purpose of giving effect to the said Act : Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, acting with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulation (that is say):—

The Clerk of Committees of the Legislative Assembly and the temporary Assistant Clerks of Committees when travelling on duty with the Parliamentary Standing Committee on Railways, or any sectional Committee thereof, shall be entitled to receive a sum of One pound per diem for travelling expenses, exclusive of the cost of travelling by railway, coach, steam-boat, or other conveyance.

And the Honorable Allan McLean, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
