MINOR ARTICLES.

IN accordance with the provisions of section 8 of the *Customs and Excise Duties Act 1890*, I hereby order that the undermentioned articles be admitted free of duty as Minor Articles, viz.:—

Match-box Strikers, of metal, to be attached to the end of leather boxes.
