CHARGES FOR COUNTRY TELEPHONE EXCHANGES.

PRESENTED TO BOTH HOUSES OF PARLIAMENT IN PURSUANCE OF SECTION 98 OF
THE POST OFFICE ACT 1890.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, pursuant to the provisions of the *Post Office Act 1890*, has been pleased to approve that, from the 1st July, 1894, the following charges be made in connexion with Country Telephone Exchanges :—

Rental for each additional half-mile of line or under beyond the first mile from any Exchange	£1 0 0
Rental of extension lines per quarter-mile or under up to one mile	1 0 0
Each additional half-mile or under beyond first mile	1 0 0
Mileage to be calculated radially from the Exchange, and in regard to extensions, from starting point of such extensions, allowance, however, to be made for shortage on the Exchange line.	
Extra telephone sets for extension lines, and two-figure switch-board, including service at Exchange	£3 0 0
First year's rent to be paid in advance, subsequent rent to be paid in advance yearly, half-yearly, or quarterly, at the option of the Postmaster-General.
