CHARGES FOR PRIVATE TELEGRAPH AND TELEPHONE LINES.

PRESENTED TO BOTH HOUSES OF PARLIAMENT IN PURSUANCE OF SECTION 98 OF THE
 POST OFFICE ACT 1890.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, pursuant to the provisions of the *Post Office Act* 1890, has been pleased to approve that, from the 1st July, 1894, the following be the Rates for Private Telegraph and Telephone Lines :—

| For any distance not exceeding one mile | £4 0 0 |
| Distance in excess of one mile computed at per half-mile | 1 0 0 |
| Telephone sets, each | 2 10 0 |

No agreement to be made with a subscriber for the erection of a private line beyond the radius of three miles from a Telephone Exchange for any period less than three years.
