MINOR ARTICLES USED IN MANUFACTURE.

PRESENTED TO BOTH HOUSES OF PARLIAMENT PURSUANT TO LAW.

MINOR ARTICLES.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by section 8 of the *Customs and Excise Duties Act* 1890, I hereby direct that the list of minor articles used in the manufacture of dutiable articles, and as such to be admitted free of duty, dated the 27th December, 1889, be amended as follows :—

APPAREL AND SLOPS.

Buckles, buttons and fasteners, with or without split rings or fasteners for same, and not being jewellery.

To read—

APPAREL AND SLOPS.

Buckles, clasps, buttons and fasteners, with or without split rings or fasteners for same, and not being jewellery or fancy buckles or clasps.

This order to take effect from the 8th March, 1895.
