DUTY ON PERSIAN LEATHER.

PRESENTED TO BOTH HOUSES OF PARLIAMENT PURSUANT TO LAW.

Customs and Excise Duties Act 1890.

DUTY ON PERSIAN LEATHER.

WHEREAS certain leather, known as "Persian Goat," is imported into Victoria, and the said leather, in my opinion, is apparently a substitute for that known as "Persian Sheep," and the said "Persian Sheep" leather is dutiable at the rate of 35 per cent. *ad valorem*, it is hereby notified for general information that I do hereby, in accordance with the powers conferred upon me by section 5 of the *Customs and Excise Duties Act 1890*, order and direct that the same rate of duty shall be charged upon Persian Goat leather as upon Persian Sheep leather.

The Order of 20th February, 1894, relating to Persian leather, and published in the *Government Gazette* of 2nd March, 1894, is hereby cancelled.
