REPORT

TO THE HONORABLE THE CHIEF SECRETARY.

Melbourne, 30th March, 1895.

SIR,

I beg leave to submit the Report of the Trustees of the Public Library, Museums, and National Gallery of Victoria for the year 1894.

Including all the divisions of the Library there were 152,711 volumes at the end of the year. The number of volumes presented was less by 1,280 than during 1893; but many valuable and important gifts have been received from the Governments of Great Britain, the United States of America, France, Belgium, Canada, the Colonies of Australasia, and India.

The Lending Library continues to advance in all ways; the number of books lent during the year having increased to 120,030 volumes, and the number of borrowers to 11,647.

There have been lent to 34 Country Libraries 6,050 volumes.

The Trustees have proposed the establishment of a Library Association of Australasia corresponding to those of the United Kingdom and America. The scheme is under the consideration of the Trustees of the Libraries in the other Colonies, and it is hoped that it may be adopted.

The only additions made to the collection of pictures were a view of the interior of the Church of St. Anne, at Bruges, by David Roberts, R.A.; and Victorian Works, by Messrs. Mather, McCubbin, Davies, and Withers, with drawings by D. Vierge and Phil May.

Mr. Longstaff's original picture, "The Sirens," painted according to the conditions of the Travelling Scholarship, has been received.

The most noteworthy event of the year has been the interchange of pictures with the National Galleries of Sydney and Adelaide for exhibition in Melbourne. In the absence of new works acquired by purchase—for which no funds are now provided—these loans have been much appreciated by the public, and the Trustees desire to express their acknowledgments to the Trustees of the Sydney and Adelaide Galleries for the very good selections sent to Melbourne. It is hoped that these exchanges will be continued until at last all the best works in each Gallery have been exhibited in all the Colonies taking part in the arrangement.

An illustrated catalogue of the National Collection has been issued, which will be found useful to visitors, and, the reproductions having been very well executed, a good judgment may be formed from the catalogue of the character and quality of the works in the National Gallery by persons at a distance.

The specimens of Victorian timber have been re-arranged and re-numbered in conformity with the new catalogue. The Superintendent complains that he no longer has the means of supplying the public with the determinations upon minerals sent in for examination, which formed one of the most valuable uses of the Museum before the Votes were reduced.

The Honorable W. A. Zeal, M.L.C., and the Honorable Thomas Bent have been appointed Trustees.

REPORT OF THE LIBRARIAN TO THE COMMITTEE OF THE
PUBLIC LIBRARY FOR THE YEAR 1894.

The Public Library,
13th March, 1895.

To the Chairman of the Library Committee.

SIR,

I have the honour to submit my Report for the year 1894.

The Public Library, the Lending Library, and the Country Lending Library contained 152,711 volumes at the end of 1894.

The usual statistical information follows :—

I.—THE PUBLIC LIBRARY.

During the year the Library received—

2,339 volumes,
27,083 pamphlets and parts,
57,899 newspapers,
328 maps and plans.

The additions in 1893 were—

3,878 volumes,
28,193 pamphlets and parts,
54,261 newspapers,
248 maps and plans.

There has been a large falling-off in the number of donations as compared with 1893, the decrease amounting to 1,280 volumes. However, many important contributions have been received from the Governments of Great Britain, the United States, France, Belgium, Canada, the Australian Colonies, and India, and from 195 individual contributors.

The amount spent during the year in the purchase of books is £746 4s. 9d. as against £961 14s. 1d. of the previous year, and in bookbinding £731 16s. 7d. as against £740 4s. 6d. of the previous year.

At the end of 1894 there were 135,640 volumes in the Public Library.

Three hundred and eighty-four thousand and seventy-three visits were paid to the Reading Room during the year.

Two hundred and sixty Government publications were presented to 239 institutions and persons.

II.—THE LENDING LIBRARY.

During the year 120,030 volumes were lent. The number of borrowers on the 31st December, 1894, was 11,647.

REPORT ON THE INDUSTRIAL AND TECHNOLOGICAL MUSEUM.

*To the Chairman, Industrial and Technological Museum Committee.*The Industrial and Technological Museum,
14th March, 1895.

SIR,

I have the honour to submit the following report for the year 1894 :—

The descriptive catalogues of the rocks and timbers of Victoria have been published, and on sale to the public for some time past.

During the year, 207 specimens were received in donations, as per appended list, 35 in exchanges, and 18 purchases. A magnificent specimen of Cerussite (carbonate of lead), with Crocoite (chromate of lead), from the Adelaide Mine, Dundas, Tasmania, was lent to the Museum by Mr. Thos. Creer. The "McGregor Trophy," which had been lent for twelve months by the Victorian Rifle Association, was withdrawn temporarily last December. A collection of 127 various minerals was prepared and forwarded to the Library and Museum, Geelong, to replace a collection belonging to the Mechanics' Institute of that city.

Many of the duplicate minerals were removed from the basement to the reserved space in the old Museum, where they were properly arranged and recorded, thus giving great facilities for the preparation of exchange or presentation collections. A large number of minerals in the collections which were without information have been labelled, and the Museum in this respect may be now considered satisfactory. Twelve mineral cases have been constructed, and will shortly be utilized for the purpose of relieving those which have become unduly crowded.

In the Botanical Museum the Victorian timbers have been re-arranged and re-numbered to conform with the new catalogue, a collection of 37 Queensland timbers placed on exhibit, and also a collection of 68 Fijian timbers, presented by the Commissioners of the International Exhibition 1880-81.

As a large number of minerals are sent in by the public for determination, I again wish to call attention to the want of proper means for making these determinations, thereby considerably diminishing the value they might otherwise have, and at the same time largely reducing the sphere of usefulness of the Museum.

REPORT ON THE NATIONAL GALLERY.

To the Chairman of the National Gallery Committee.

SIR,

I have the honour to submit to you the following report on the work of the National Gallery for the year 1894 :—

“Interior of the Church of St. Anne, Bruges,” by David Roberts, R.A.

“Autumn in the Fitzroy Gardens,” by J. Mather.

“Feeding Time,” by F. McCubbin.

“Moonrise,” by D. Davies.

“A Bright Winter’s Morning,” by W. Withers.

And two pen and ink drawings by D. Vierge and Phil May.

The Trustees have received from Mr. Longstaff, as the third and last picture required of him under the terms of the Travelling Scholarship awarded to him in 1887, an original work, “The Sirens.” During the year a scheme was initiated by the Trustees, and adopted by the Galleries of New South Wales and South Australia, whereby an interchange of pictures on loan has been effected. Under this scheme six oil paintings from each Gallery have been exchanged.

A new illustrated catalogue of the National Gallery has been issued, to take the place of the edition published in 1891, which was out of print.

There were 21 students in the Painting Classes each term, and 83 and 87 in the Drawing Classes during the first and second terms respectively. In the drawing and life classes I have to report a very decided improvement.

The Students’ Exhibition was opened by Sir George Verdon on the 14th of December, when the prize of the school was awarded to Mr. Kny for his model of a figure from life.

I enclose the report made by the gentlemen appointed by the Trustees to award the prizes, and also Mr. McCubbin’s report on the work of the Drawing Schools.

The accompanying schedules give details as to the additions made to the Art Collections in the course of the year.

DIRECTOR'S PROGRESS REPORT OF THE NATIONAL MUSEUM FOR
THE YEAR 1894.

The Chairman, the Committee of the National Museum.

SIR,

I have the honour to forward the annual schedules of donations to the National Museum, marked A; of the specimens purchased in the colony, marked B; of the visitors, marked C; and of the exchanges, marked D.

The reduction in the allowance for contingencies from £1,000 to £200, a greater reduction than has been found necessary in any other section of the Government departments, has left the Museum not merely without means to purchase desirable additions to the collections, but without funds for the payment for necessaries for carrying on the routine work.

The allowance from the Library vote for 1893-4 was only £200, but, with the aid of a credit balance of £189 19s. 8d. from previous year, by the strictest economy I managed to keep the expenditure within the sum at my disposal. In regard to the vote for 1894-5 I stated that I would endeavour to keep within an allowance of £300, but only £200 was allocated. This being now exhausted, I have applied for a further sum of £100, and trust that this small allowance may be granted.
