CHARGES FOR TRANSMISSION OF TELEGRAMS
 WITHIN VICTORIA.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

PRESENTED TO BOTH HOUSES OF PARLIAMENT PURSUANT TO LAW.

THE Administrator of the Government in Council has been pleased to approve that from the 15th May, 1895, inclusive the rates to be charged on telegrams for transmission within Victoria be as follows :—

Nine words or under	Ninepence.
Each additional word	One penny.

The address and signature to be transmitted free of charge.

Telegrams to be delivered free within a radius of One mile from the Telegraph Office of destination. A fee of Threepence to be charged on telegrams to be delivered beyond One mile and within a radius of One mile and a half from the Telegraph Office of destination.
