REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES OF THE PUBLIC LIBRARY,  
MUSEUMS, AND NATIONAL GALLERY OF VICTORIA.

TO THE HONORABLE THE CHIEF SECRETARY.

SIR,

I have the honour to submit the following report for the year 1911 :—

I.—THE PUBLIC LIBRARY.

The Library continues to make steady progress, but there were no special features which require comment during the period under review.

The number of volumes in all branches of the Library is now 277,046, and the crowding of the shelves and store rooms continues to cause such inconvenience that the opening of the new Reading Rooms is most anxiously awaited. It is hoped that this will be possible before the end of the present year.

The reclassification of the Reference Library in accordance with the Dewey Decimal System is proceeding as rapidly as circumstances permit, and the system will come into operation when the collections are removed into the new Reading Rooms.

The difficulties in connexion with the use of Victorian marble for decorating the entrance to the new buildings have been overcome, and rapid progress is being made in preparing marble from the neighbourhood of Buchan for this purpose.

II.—THE NATIONAL GALLERY.

Under the terms of the Felton Bequest some important pictures were received during the year, viz. :—

Portrait of Theophila Palmer, by Sir Joshua Reynolds.

Portrait of Mrs. Robinson, by John Hoppner.

“Farmyard Scene,” by George Morland.

Portrait of Admiral Deans, by Sir Henry Raeburn.

“Endormies,” by Rupert Bunny.

For the second time since the introduction of the Travelling Scholarship for the students of the National Gallery it was won by a lady, Miss C. W. Honey, who will continue to prosecute her studies in art in European centres.

The Trustees are under obligations to Mrs. Swan for the gift of four chalk drawings by the late J. M. Swan, R.A., and to Mr. E. H. MacKay for lending a very interesting portrait of a lady, by John Hoppner.

III.—THE INDUSTRIAL AND TECHNOLOGICAL MUSEUM.

The collections are still stored, and there is nothing to report in connexion with this branch of the Institution.

IV.—THE NATIONAL MUSEUM.

Professor Spencer, the Honorary Director of the Museum, has accepted for twelve months the position of Chief Protector of the natives in the Northern Territory, and during his absence Mr. J. A. Kershaw, Curator of the Zoological collections, has been appointed Acting-Director.

The Curators' reports, which are attached, contain particulars of the work of the Museum for the year.

## V. --GENERAL.

Mr. Edward Carlile, K.C., was appointed as a representative of the Trustees on the Council of the Working Men's College *vice* Professor Spencer, who resigned in consequence of accepting a position in the Northern Territory.

Mr. R. Murray Smith, who had been acting as Treasurer of the Institution since the death of Mr. James Smith, expressed a wish to retire from the office, and Mr. Carlile was elected Treasurer in his stead.

The Trustees had intended to open the Galleries and Museums during certain evenings in the week in the winter time, but the necessary arrangements could not be made in connexion with the electric lighting, and the opening had to be postponed until the coming winter season.

## PUBLIC LIBRARY REPORT, 1911.

*To the Chairman of the Library Committee.*

The Chief Librarian has the honour to report as follows :—

## I.—THE REFERENCE LIBRARY.

The total number of volumes in the Reference Library is now 207,244, the additions for the year numbering 6,682.

The amount spent on binding was £1,344 19s. 9d., as compared with £1,532 10s. 9d. for the previous year.

The following are some of the more important additions during the year :—

- "Bibliotheca Lindesiana," presented by the Earl of Crawford.
- Aristotle, "Commentaria in Aristotelem Graeca," 31 vols.
- Gould, J., "Icones avium."
- Balzac, H., works, 53 vols.
- Cramer and Stoll's "Papillons exotiques," 10 vols.
- "Encyclopædia Britannica," 11th ed.
- Blair, E. H., and Robertson, J. A., eds., "Philippine Islands," 55 vols.
- Reprint of the "Ellesmere Chaucer," 2 vols.

A special exhibition of Bibles was held in the Macarthur Gallery in April, in connexion with the tercentenary celebrations of the publication of the Authorized version of the Bible. The exhibition attracted considerable attention, and was largely attended.

Satisfactory progress is being made in building the new Reading Rooms, and it is thought that they should be ready for occupation before the end of the present year.

## II.—THE LENDING LIBRARY.

The most noticeable feature in connexion with the Lending Branch is the steady falling off in the demand for fiction. In this department alone the issues were less than in the previous year by 5,553. In other branches of literature the issues were very similar in number to those of the year 1910.

The only losses recorded at the annual stocktaking were three books of trifling value.

During the year 1,368 books were bound or repaired at a cost of £203 7s. 3d.

The number of borrowers was slightly less than in the previous year, the figures being 9,126 as against 9,414 for the year 1910.

The total number of volumes issued was 158,871, as compared with 167,445 issued in 1910.

I have the honour to submit to you the following report on the work of the National Gallery for the year 1911 :—

During the year, in all, £8,471 2s. 6d. has been expended on additions to the Art collections, of which sum all, except £6 2s. 6d., was spent in pictures purchased through the Felton Bequest Funds. The five pictures acquired average £1,433 apiece.

The number of students in the painting classes was 23 in the first term, and 23 in the second. In the drawing classes, there were 40 males and 48 females in the first term; and 35 males and 46 females in the second.

Miss C. W. Honey succeeded in winning the travelling scholarship, only two competing for it on this occasion.

I enclose a list of awards made by the gentlemen appointed to act as judges at the Students' Annual Exhibition, with their report on the work shown, while the accompanying schedules give full particulars of the permanent additions and loans made to the collection during the year.

SIR,

I have the honour to forward herewith the report of the Curator of the Geological, Mineralogical, and Ethnological collections, including that from the Palaeontologist, together with one from myself dealing with the Zoological collections.

From these, it will be seen that the year has been a busy one, and a number of important additions and improvements have been made to the collections on exhibition.

The library of the Museum now comprises about 6,000 volumes, and continues to show so substantial an increase that the question of shelving room promises to presently cause some anxiety. During the year, as formerly, advantage has been taken of opportunities to secure special works of reference, though the funds available have been inadequate to complete some desirable sets. Further progress has also been made with the binding. The effect of the publication of the Museum Memoirs is shown in an increase of the exchanges.

Another of the Museum Memoirs, No. 4, has just been issued, and compares favorably with the previous ones. The subjects dealt with embrace zoology, geology and ethnology.

## REPORT ON THE ZOOLOGICAL DEPARTMENT.

National Museum, 22nd March, 1912.

*To the Chairman of the National Museum Committee.*

SIR,

I have the honour to forward the following report, dealing with the Zoological collections, for the past year:—

During the year special attention has been devoted to the collections in the store-room. These have been overhauled, and, as far as possible, rearranged, both with a view to economize space and to render them easy of access for purposes of reference.

A number of specimens which have been stored away for some years were sorted out, and, after being renovated and remounted, placed on exhibition. These include fine examples of the Saw-fish, Sword-fish, Dugong, and Dolphin.

A series of Deer and other horns, including some excellent specimens, was also selected and placed in the main hall, and will be added to from those in the store-rooms as opportunity permits.

The skeleton of a large Hippopotamus has been set up, and placed in a special case adjacent to the stuffed specimens.

The arrangement of the collection of Australian fishes in the gallery of the Australian Hall has been completed, and this has permitted of the gallery being thrown open to the public.

The preparation of the Australian invertebrates, which will occupy the remaining space in this gallery, is now in hand, and, it is expected, the specimens will be on view during the present year.

The transfer of the Australian fishes from the general collection has allowed space for the extension of the foreign collection of fishes and invertebrates, and, to some extent, of the reptiles. Although the Museum possesses a valuable collection of these groups, they have hitherto been very inadequately represented, owing to the difficulty of showing them to proper advantage.

The work of cataloguing and registering the specimens in the reference collection has been continued, and good progress made. Up to date, 5,000 specimens have been dealt with.

During the year a special case containing a group of *Canis* was completed. An interesting series of the birds in various stages of growth, together with the nest and eggs, are shown.

An additional wall-case, to allow of the extension of the collection of Australian birds is being constructed, and when completed will enable a number of additional species to be displayed, besides relieving the overcrowded state of some of the other cases.

Owing to alterations being made to the old Museum building in the University grounds, it was found necessary to remove the skeleton of the large whale—the last connecting link with the old Museum—to the present building. This whale, the skeleton of which measures about 90 feet in length, was found stranded on the beach near Jan Juc, on the Victorian coast, in 1857. At considerable expense the skeleton was preserved under the supervision of the late Mr. W. Kershaw, by whom it was afterwards articulated. The Director, the late Sir Frederick McCoy, determined it to be a new species of Whalebone Whale, to which he gave the name *Physalis grayi*, after the well-known scientist, John Edward Gray, of the British Museum. After nearly 45 years' exposure to the weather outside the old Museum building, the skeleton has deteriorated very materially. Portion of the whalebone from this specimen was preserved, and is now exhibited in the main hall, together with a photograph of the complete skeleton.

During the year two well-known and valuable thoroughbred Arab stallions were presented to the Museum. One of these, "Rafyk," died at Condah Hills, in the Western District, and was presented by Mr. H. P. Cooke, of "Ardnaree," Young, N.S.W. For the other we are indebted to Mrs. B. Elliott Sandford, of Upper Rossall Stud Farm, Ringwood. Both the skins and skeletons have been preserved.

The condition of the collections is satisfactory.

The reference collection is frequently referred to by specialists and others, who appreciate the facilities afforded them in connexion with their studies. A large number of specimens of various kinds have been forwarded for identification and information.

In November, Mr. F. W. Baillie, Assistant Taxidermist, retired after over 35 years' service. Arrangements are now in progress to fill his place.

The donations received include a second collection of fishes, &c., from the Hon. the Minister of Trade and Customs. These were obtained chiefly in Bass Strait and off the Victorian and New South Wales coasts by the Commonwealth trawler *Endeavour*, and they embrace a number of interesting species not previously represented in the Museum collection.

From the Council of the Royal Zoological and Acclimatization Society of Victoria were received, among others, a Cassowary (*Casuarus australis*), a young Anoa (*Bos depressicornis*), Striped Hyena (*Hyena striata*), and full-grown Sloth Bear (*Melursus labiatus*).

By purchase was obtained a valuable and rare bower or playing-place of the Golden Bower Bird (*Prionodura newtoniana*), from Northern Queensland. The bower constructed by this species is the largest of its kind, and is usually composed of small sticks piled up horizontally round the base of a sapling to the height of from 4 to 6 feet. Owing to its fragile nature, it is very difficult to obtain intact. It is proposed to erect this example in a special case, together with the birds, for exhibition in the Australian Hall.

The accompanying schedules show the additions received during the year.

NATIONAL MUSEUM.—REPORT ON THE GEOLOGICAL, MINERALOGICAL,  
AND ETHNOLOGICAL COLLECTIONS.

*To the Director of the National Museum.*

National Museum,

SIR,

I have the honour to submit the Annual Report for the year 1911 :—

MINERALOGICAL AND GEOLOGICAL COLLECTIONS.

During the year some interesting Australian mineral specimens were secured by exchange and purchase, and a number were also obtained as gifts. Among the latter may be mentioned fine examples of the rarer Broken Hill minerals, presented by Mr. A. E. Savage. The foreign mineral collection has likewise been augmented by the purchase of various species not previously represented in the Museum.

The collection illustrating geological structures has been labelled, and increased by the addition of examples of slickens, footprints, striations, and specimens showing the effects of crushing and metamorphism. Whenever possible, local specimens are employed; and during my holidays I was able to collect from near Mansfield some of those which it was desirable to include in the series.

A geological relief map of Vesuvius, recently modelled, was purchased from Sig. Aureli, of Rome; and one of the Commonwealth Federal Territory was presented by the Hon. the Minister for Home Affairs. The three old relief maps of Vesuvius, Teneriffe and the Island of Palma were renovated, and the case in which they were displayed was reconstructed and made dust-proof.

A wall case, 34 feet long, has been made, and placed in the fossil gallery between the doorways leading into the room of the Australian zoological collections. It was designed to accommodate the large Australian fossils, formerly exhibited in temporary cases, and to provide additional space for similar specimens.

Of the more important additions to the exhibited palaeontological collections may be mentioned the instructive series of models of the fore and hind feet and a skull of members of the horse family, a fine model of the skull of *Megaladapis*, the extinct giant lemur of Madagascar, and a large block of coral-bearing limestone from the Thomson River, Gippsland. In addition to these, an unmounted cast of *Aepyornis*, the large extinct bird of Madagascar, was purchased from Mr. E. Damon, of Weymouth. When this specimen is set up and displayed with the egg of the bird, which we are so fortunate in possessing, it should prove an exceedingly interesting exhibit.

Several large collections of Victorian fossils were received during the year, including notable donations from Messrs. R. H. Anscar, G. S. Green, J. T. Jutson, W. J. Parr, F. P. Spry, and Dr. T. S. Hall.

In conjunction with the hon. director, I worked out the series of bones collected by myself at Pejark Marsh in 1909. The result of this work was published as a paper, "The origin of Cuts on Bones of Australian Extinct Marsupials," in Vol. 24, Part I, of the Proc. Royal Society of Victoria, 1911.

During the year Miss Cane was able to devote some of her time to the very desirable work of typing the catalogue of the registered palaeontological specimens.

The following is the report of the Palaeontologist, Mr. F. Chapman, on his work for the year :—

The arrangement of the Australasian and foreign collections of fossils having been completed, special attention was given during the year to the exhibited collections, to render them more interesting by the insertion of additional descriptive labels and diagrams.

The card index of fossils in course of preparation by Miss Cane was checked to date, and the location of the specimens inserted.

During the year 121 specimens were registered, bringing the number in the permanent collection up to 12,106.

The opportunity was taken to study certain groups of fossils in the Museum, as the silurian *Lingulæ* and Trilobites, many of which proved to be new to science, throwing additional light on the relationships of the Victorian palæozoic forms to those of Europe, North America, and elsewhere. Many microscope sections of these and other fossils, including corals from the Mallee bores, were made during the year in order to unravel difficulties in regard to their structure.

Official visits were made to quarries round Lilydale, from which a valuable series of fossils from the mudstone were obtained; to the new grading works at the Flemington railway cutting; to Messrs. Cuming, Smith, and Co.'s works at Yarraville, where a series of fish-teeth from florida phosphatic gravel was collected.

The fossil determinations made for the public during 1911 dealt with 832 specimens, the largest number recorded for one year. Many of these were presented to the Museum collection, and comprised several new and important species.

Detailed reports on the bores in the Mallee and at Sorrento are in course of preparation, and that of the former locality, which has been delayed owing to the large amount of work involved in writing numerous descriptions and drawing illustrations of the new and rare species, will probably be ready for publication during 1912. In the sorting and examination of the Sorrento fossiliferous washings, I have had assistance from Mr. R. A. Keble, of the Mines Department. The results of the Sorrento borings are, so far, extremely valuable and interesting, and when the report is completed will afford a standard of comparison between the various tertiary deposits in Southern Australia. A preliminary synopsis of the Sorrento boring has already been sent in to the Department of Mines, and published in the last Annual Report.

Several detailed reports on fossils, with descriptions and illustrations, were written for the Department of Mines during the current year. They include descriptions of palæozoic corals and other fossils from Loyola, Deep Creek, and Cooper's Creek, Gippsland; jurassic fossils from Wonthaggi; and palæozoic fossils from Jamieson and Warrandyte. Altogether, 135 fossils were examined and reported upon. It is to be regretted, from a scientific stand-point, that some of these reports, sent in as far back as July, 1908, have not yet been published, since there is always the possibility of some of the work being superseded by later research in the same field.

A descriptive report on New and Rare Ostracoda from several localities in New South Wales has been prepared for the Department of Mines, New South Wales, for publication in their Records.

I have sorted, mounted and named an extensive series of Foraminifera and Ostracoda from the soundings in the Antarctic, obtained by the Shackleton Expedition, and have prepared a report on the same, illustrated by six plates. This has now been sent to London for publication.

## ETHNOLOGICAL COLLECTION.

After two years' delay, we received from the Field Museum of Chicago the Totem Pole agreed upon as an exchange for a collection of Australian aboriginal articles. This pole, which is about 40 feet long, was procured through Dr. C. F. Newcombe, of Victoria, B.C., from Skidegate, Queen Charlotte Islands, and is a valuable and attractive addition to the collections. Owing to its size, it had to be erected in the Zoological Hall, the only available space giving the required height. We still await the particulars concerning its history.

As in previous years, Mr. A. S. Kenyon has made for the Museum numerous collections of stone implements, for which we are greatly indebted to him. By his help, our collections of these Australian implements are probably much more extensive than those held by any other Museum.

Mr. A. R. McCrae, too, must also be again mentioned among our valued contributors; and Mr. S. F. Mann, of Caramut, purchased for, and presented to, us an extremely interesting and valuable series of ceremonial stone adzes from British New Guinea, used as gravestones.

Both public and reference collections are in good condition, owing to the care and attention exercised by Mr. Roche, who devotes much of his time when free from his regular duties as attendant to this very necessary work.
