NOTE.—The figures for the first nine years may, for statistical purposes, be regarded as final; those for the last year—which have been revised to 31st Dec., 1913—will be liable to future correction. It should be stated, however, that there is no finality to the changes which may occur for back years in the Income Tax Registers, but such changes will not materially affect the above results. The Income Tax was imposed by Act 58 Vict. No. 1374, passed on the 29th January, 1895, and Regulations framed thereunder, dated the 14th March, 1895, and is levied on incomes earned after deducting all outgoings and expenses incurred in the production of income, an exemption of £200 being allowed until 1903, except in the case of absentees. For the five years 1903, 1904, 1905, 1906, and 1907 the exemption was reduced to £100, allowed to both resident and non-resident taxpayers, except companies, on incomes between £120 and £500 in 1903, between £151 and £500 in 1904, between £157 and £500 in 1905 and 1906, and between £201 and £500 in 1907. For 1908, 1909, 1910, 1911, 1912, and 1913 the exemption was £150 on incomes between £201 and £500, except companies; and in addition for the years 1908, 1909, and 1910 a rebate of 20 per cent. on assessments was allowed to all taxpayers except companies. The rates of tax applied to incomes of £201 and upwards for the year 1912-13, were as follows:—

NOTE.—Pensions and gratuities to the police are payable under the Police Regulation Act (54 Vict. No. 1127) out of a fund called the Police Superannuation Fund. This fund is maintained by an endowment from the consolidated revenue, by a moiety of fines inflicted by the courts of petty sessions, by a deduction not exceeding 2½ per cent. from the pay of members of the force entitled to pensions, by transfers from the Licensing Fund under Act No. 2068, and, when the foregoing sources are insufficient, by further grants in aid from the consolidated revenue. In 1912-13, the ordinary receipts were as follow:—Government endowment, £2,000; fines, £4,635; deductions from pay (at 2½ per cent.), £4,774; transfer from Licensing Fund, £24,089; Government subsidy voted to supplement endowment, £15,000; total, £50,498. The balance at the credit of the fund on the 1st July, 1912, was £12,132; and on the 30th June, 1913, £8,762. During the past twenty-six years it has been necessary to vote £600,184 (exclusive of endowment and of £111,763 transferred from the Licensing Fund) in aid of the fund, or an average of £23,084 per annum.
