The travel related to both electorate business and parliamentary business, in particular with respect to my role as Shadow Parliamentary Secretary for Justice and Corrections.

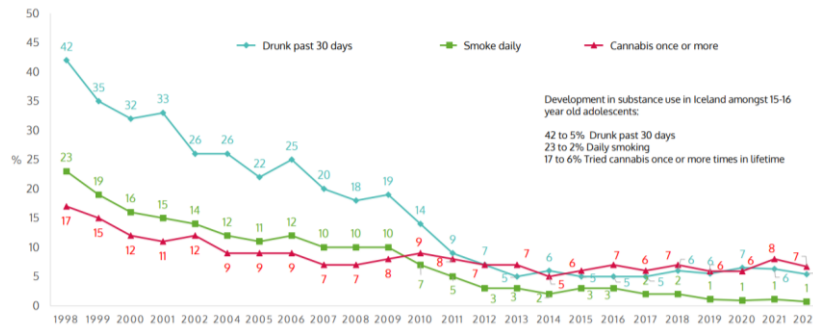
For the Parliamentary Study Tour to Canada – primarily of benefit for both the Mornington Electorate and my roles as Shadow Parliamentary Secretary for Justice and Corrections and Liberal Party Whip in the Legislative Assembly – a particular objective was learning and looking at comparative justice and corrections issues and policies in Canada and within Canadian provinces, and if, how, and whether they should be implemented within Victoria, Australia. Within this objective, a focus was learning about and looking at:

- Canada's implementation of the evidence-based Planet Youth ([Icelandic Prevention Model](#)) to engage young people in positive activities and thrills to prevent boredom, anti-social behaviour, alcohol and drug use, and to direct youth into positive activities such as to become productive members of society. This model has had outstanding outcomes in Iceland in terms of significantly turning around very bad levels of youth delinquency, alcohol and drug use, to Iceland now having some of the best outcomes in these areas in the world (see chart **below**). I am in the process of developing a policy proposal (see [early draft of concept](#))

for the Opposition Liberal Party/Coalition to implement the Planet Youth model across Victoria should we win government, which may also then influence the current government to also implement this as a policy now. Through the links created in Canada and subsequent referrals, on 8 August 2023 my office and I had a meeting the heads of Planet Youth in Iceland via Zoom to garner further insights on how we could implement the model in Victoria.

What Then Happened

From highest to lowest in substance use in Iceland – 15/16 year old students



- Learning from and seeing in person the impacts of Canada’s drug policies when it comes to legalisation of cannabis, drug injecting rooms, driving while using low levels of medicinal cannabis, and so forth, such as to inform my input to proposing and developing Liberal Party/Coalition policies in Victoria around drug use decriminalisation, driving while using medicinal cannabis, drug injecting rooms, etc. I saw major issues with drug legalisation and drug injecting rooms, where there was not associated support systems and rehabilitation/compulsory rehabilitation and prevention models in place, where users of cannabis were seemingly also going on to harder and harder drugs.
- Discussing and learning from Canada when it comes to their policies to tackle modern slavery, create responsible enterprise and eliminate and remediate modern slavery in entity supply chains at a local, provincial and nationwide level, whether in labour hire licencing laws, modern slavery legislation, provincial procurement and so forth, such as to inform my input to proposing and developing Liberal Party/Coalition policies in Victoria around better tackling modern slavery, and in eliminating modern slavery from Victorian procurement, including in the Victorian Government’s operations and supply chains (particularly linking in my former work bringing about Australia’s *Modern Slavery Act*, working with Canada to help them bring about their own modern slavery legislation recently, and international collaboration between Victoria, Australia, Canada and Canadian provinces on tackling modern slavery).
- Specifically learning from Canadian policies and outcomes, or lack thereof, when it comes to rehabilitation services, in particular looking at the benefits and detriments of compulsory rehabilitation models, such as to inform my input to proposing and developing Liberal Party/Coalition policies in Victoria in this area.
- Learning about the work of the British Columbia ombudsperson and how that compares with Victoria’s ombudsman, and how Victoria’s system could be improved and better supported.
- More broadly, nationwide and provincial policies in Canada that could be implemented in the justice and corrections space in Victoria, Australia.

Recommendations arising, that I am now looking at developing policy proposals in relation to, include:

- *That Victoria implement the Planet Youth (Icelandic Prevention Model), with a potential trial to begin with that could be in Frankston and the Mornington Peninsula.*
- *That Victoria legalise driving while using medicinal cannabis, up to certain prescribed levels, with associated testing systems being invested in and put in place.*
- *That Victoria look to drug decriminalisation, but not legalisation, with any drug decriminalisation to be directly tied in with a compulsory rehabilitation model as applied in Sweden as best practice (but not done well in Canada).*
- *That Victoria alter its system of concentrated drug injecting rooms, that then concentrates issues of drug use, crime and anti-social behaviour, instead looking to deconcentrate this service through the use of hospitals, doctors clinics and pharmacies across Victoria, directly linked in with rehabilitation and compulsory rehabilitation services.*
- *That Victoria implement a wide-ranging procurement policy to eliminate and remediate modern slavery from its own operations and supply chains, and to encourage those going for Victorian tenders/contracts to do the same. This would include Victoria voluntarily reporting under Australia's Modern Slavery Act.*
- *That I work with Canadian parliamentarians in advocating for a joint modern slavery register, that can then have positive outcomes in Canada and Canadian provinces, and in Australia and its states and territories, including Victoria.*

More generally, in relation to my role as Whip, in the electorate and across Victoria, other objectives included:

- Learning about different practices and procedures in Whips' roles and more generally in both the Legislative Assembly of British Columbia and the Canadian Parliament's House of Commons and Senate, that can be utilised to enhance my work as Liberal Party (Opposition) Whip and my work as a parliamentarian in the Victorian Legislative Assembly.
- Enhancing my knowledge in various areas of interest relevant to my electorate, and more broadly, including:
 - Seniors' services.
 - Enhancing programming literacy in schools to transform lives.
 - Learning about ways our Parliament, community and I can better engage with young people through creative means to influence positive and better social outcomes, knowledge/learning (such as in IT/Science), and to inspire young people to follow their dreams and aspirations.
 - Looking at and learning from different ways to produce cleaner and greener baseload energy systems here in Victoria, such as through hydroelectricity.
 - Looking at better global collaboration on pandemic policies and in the interface of health and law.
 - Looking at systems to reduce childhood exposure to online pornography and predation, as well as gambling.
 - Looking at Canada's university systems and how we can garner more courses at a local and decentralised level.
 - Enhancing Mount Eliza's former Quarry as done with Butchart Gardens.
 - Learning from Canada's policies with respect to women and gender equity.
 - Looking at where we can better collaborate across the UK, Canada, Australia and NZ when it comes to policies and initiatives, including in the justice space.

Recommendations and advocacy arising, that I have implemented or will pursue in relation to policies or initiatives in Victoria and locally in my electorate, include:

- *Advocating for the implementation of some of the programs operated by the Senior Services Society of BC in the Mornington Peninsula Shire and Victoria more generally, to better assist homeless, low-income and/or isolated seniors.*
- *Advocating to implement enhanced programming literacy in schools, such as that done by Coding Dojo, given that IT/AI, etc, will greatly and increasingly shape our future. Literacy in this space may then influence social and economic outcomes for young people and future workers.*
- *Looking at ways colleagues and I can better communicate with constituents and Victorians through creative means, to better shape positive outcomes.*
- *Following up connections to link parliamentarians at the federal and Victorian levels in Australia to influence more organised, coordinated and fairer systems when it comes to pandemic policies into the future.*
- *Proposing greater investment in renewable/greener baseload energy systems, particularly when it comes to hydroelectricity, geothermal powers, hydrogen, and nuclear (fusion and fission).*
- *Looking at implementing online ratings systems to reduce child exposure to pornography, predation and gambling, and policies for in-game advertisements with external links, etc.*
- *Pursuing enhancement and investment in Mount Eliza's former Moorooduc Quarry, perhaps similar to what was done with Butchart Gardens.*
- *Pursuing my proposal for a matching program to link those who need a room/home with those who can offer it, to better tackle homelessness and lack of housing.*
- *Advocating for enhancing university and university courses on the Mornington Peninsula.*
- *Better shaping my views when it comes to women's and trans-rights issues.*
- *As noted above, pursuing and advocating for a combined international modern slavery register, that could include Canada and Australia, but also the UK and New Zealand, and all states/provinces within, as a great step of collaboration within CANZUK.*
